STEPHEN LITTLE: RED PLANET: Stephen Little's *Red Planet*, 2016, is a high definition digital video depicting recorded footage from the mission of Opportunity, a NASA Mars Exploration Rover (MER). *Red Planet* shows a translation of raw data recordings transmitted from Opportunity to Earth via visuals and sounds. This footage describes the Martian surface and terrain of Mars.

MARTIN SHAW: THREE WELL KNOWN AUSTRALIANS: When Martin Shaw painted *Three Well Known Australians* in 1982, he sparked a guessing game that has entertained and intrigued generations of Australians. This enigmatic artwork has travelled to galleries, libraries and public halls non-stop since that time, inviting viewers across the nation to guess the identity of the figures it depicts. It was last seen in Bathurst in 2008 when Kevin Rudd was PM and the Apple iPhone was officially released in Australia.
