The Fair reserves the right to inspect and reject animals in inappropriate condition. Competitors are responsible for the care of their animals, including feed, water and hay for the duration of the Fair. All entrants must discuss the security of their rabbits with the Barn Supervisor.

### **FLOWERS**

- Cut stems as long as possible. Do not use rocks or twist-ties to support flowers in their containers.
- Sprays and cuts are to be complete with buds and leaves. In other cases, buds and foliage should be removed unless otherwise stated.
- Label your entries with the variety name for the benefit of the people who come to see the exhibits. Education is our aim!.
- Be sure all flowers are free of insects.
