In the event of an emergency such as a COVID 19 outbreak, wildfire, tsunami, earthquake, and flooding, CFNR commits all of its resources, and has the capability, to get communications out 24/7 to its listeners with the latest information and updates on the situation and any orders that are in effect. CFNR works with local emergency services providers to relay messages on evacuations, marshalling areas, and when it's safe to return as we receive them to ensure community members' safety.
