Mar 27 Depart Vancouver for the Holy Land

Make your own way to Vancouver International Airport to check in for your overnight flight to Tel Aviv via Toronto. Enjoy in flight meals and services

Mar 28 God, I am Here Now!

Arrive this morning at Ben Gurion International Airport where the group will be met by our local representative and transferred to the hotel for check in. Enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure. Overnight in Tel Aviv

Mar 29 To Stand up and Walk

After breakfast, we will start our tour at 09:30am with a visit to the House of Peter in Jaffa (Acts 10) then we will visit Gil-Gal a totally unique, messianic Jewish center for evangelism. We then continue on to Caesarea along the Mediterranean Coast. This is where Peter went in Acts 10-11 by the command of the Lord and due to this many were baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the first time. This will be followed by a late afternoon arrival in Tiberias. Check in at the hotel for dinner and an overnight.

Mar 30 The First Love

We now find ourselves in the "holy triangle" which is a very small area where Jesus performed a great portion of His miracles. First, we will visit the Mount of Beatitudes the site that commemorates the Sermon on the Mount (Matt 5-7). Here, amidst beautiful gardens enjoy a fabulous view of the Sea of Galilee. Then we will journey on to Tabgha where the resurrected Christ met the apostles. Here we will reflect on the leader's calling to love Jesus more than anything else. Then visit Capernaum the village of Peter where Jesus was based during his time by the lake of Kinereth and tour the ancient synagogue and see the remains of the House of Peter. Then we will enjoy a traditional St. Peter's fish lunch. In the afternoon we will travel by boat on the lake. We will return back to our hotel in Tiberias for dinner and an overnight.

Mar 31 Who is God in Your life?

We will visit the site where the Jewish people set up a golden calf, Tell Dan, located by the northern border. Here we will reflect on the idols in our life and pray for protection for Israel's borders. Then we will move on to Caesarea Philipe where Jesus asked his apostles who they thought that He was. The trip back to Tiberias travels along the Syrian border and we will learn about Israel now and the turbulent situation in the Middle-East. We will finish the day by Yardenit a holy site by the River Jordan. We finish this with a mighty moment of prayer where, as a renewal of our baptisms, we will walk out into the river to be immersed by the water of the holy River Jordan! We will return back to our hotel in Tiberias for dinner and an overnight.

Apr 01 The Fire of God from the End to the Beginning

This morning we will visit the fascinating ruins of Megiddo known as Armageddon in the book of Revelation. Then we will continue on to the Mount of Carmel, where we will visit the top of the mount, where the Lord sent fire from heaven as a response to the prayer of Elijah. This afternoon we will visit Nazareth however en-route we will visit the Nazarene village, the site of a world leading, interactive research center focusing on Nazareth in the times of Jesus. Then we will continue on to the Well of Mary. We will then visit the Church of the Annunciation where we'll see the cave that tradition holds to be the home of Virgin Mary. Here, it is believed, the archangel Gabriel told the young Mary that she would become the mother of the Son of God (Luke 1:26-38). Dinner and an overnight in Tiberias

Apr 02 Pilgrimage to the Holy City through Desert and Oasis

Today we will depart early for a long exciting bus ride along the River Jordan. We will visit Beit Shean and Qumran located close to the lowest point on earth. Qumran is the home of the monastery which was founded by the Essenes. This is where a young shepherd boy discovered the Dead Sea Scrolls in 1947. We'll learn about the Essenes, who wrote the scrolls and their connection to John the Baptist. Then we'll head down to the lowest body of water on earth, the Dead Sea, which is over 1300 feet below sea level where you will have the opportunity to swim/float in the Dead Sea. If time permits we will travel on to Ein Gedi an oasis with beautiful waterfalls in the midst of the desert. This is where David was when he was being pursued by Saul. This evening we will ascend to Jerusalem the Holy City where we will check in at our hotel for dinner and an overnight.

Apr 03 You are God's temple - A Day About the Temple and the Holy Spirit

We will start our day at the south side of the temple wall where one can make a morning prayer on the very stairs to the temple where Jesus Himself walked. Then we will walk through the unique ruins from the temple compound of Jesus' time. For example, we will walk through a 2000-year-old market bordering the temple wall. Then we will look at the "Mikveh" where the



first baptisms in Acts 2 may have taken place! Then we will experience a computer animated interactive walk-through of the temple in the times of Jesus at the Davidson Center. Afterwards we will tour the quarter that was a Jewish priestly village in Jerusalem 2000 years ago. After this, we will go to the "temple institute", where items of the temple are being recreated for the very first time in 2000 years. We finish our day in the wonderful Garden Tomb which contains a tomb from the times of Jesus, where we will reflect on the resurrected Lord. Back to our hotel in Jerusalem for dinner and overnight.

Apr 04 If Someone Wants to Follow My Footsteps He Has to Take up His cross

This morning visit Gethsemane where you will have time to reflect on the deep anguish of Jesus as He was facing the cross, connecting it to anguish and testing in the life of a leader. We then make our way to the place of Jesus' birth in Bethlehem. We'll visit Shepherds' Field, where David raised his sheep and the Good News about Jesus' birth was received (Luke 2) and see the place of our Savior's birth at the Church of the Nativity. We will return back to Jerusalem to the Mount of Olives where we will take in a beautiful panoramic view of Jerusalem. From here we will go onto the Church of Dominus Flevit where our Lord stopped and cried over Jerusalem. Then we will visit the Yad Vashem containing the tragic and shocking material from witnesses of the second world war. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem

Apr 05 To Be a Witness of Jesus in Midst of the Storm

We will start the day at visit Chiapas Palace, also known as St. Peter's in Gallicantu, the traditional site of where Apostle Peter denied Christ three times before the cock crowed (Matt 26:57-75). It also contains the ruins of the palace of the High-Priest Caiaphas, where Jesus was put to jail on his last night before the cross. Then we will go to the Pools of Bethesda where Jesus cured a person who had been lame for 38 years. Then we will walk along the "Via Dolorosa"- Jesus' road to the cross. We will finish the day at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher where we will see the Tomb of Christ. You will then have the afternoon free. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem

Apr 06 God's Vision for Your Life in the Church of Jesus Christ

Today the group will be transferred back to Ben Gurion International Airport for your onward flight. Enjoy in-flight meals and services

TOUR ITINERARY:

Apr 06 JERUSALEM - AMMAN

Drive from Jerusalem to the border crossing procedures to enter Jordan. En-route to Amman stop for a visit to Jerash [ancient Gerasa], the Graeco-Roman city, and close second to Petra on the list of favorite destinations in Jordan. Boasting an unbroken chain of human occupation dating back more than 6,500 years and hidden for centuries in sand before being excavated and restored over the past 70 years, Jerash is a fine example of the grand, formal and provincial Roman towns found throughout the Middle East. One can walk beneath four imposing gates or down the "Street of Columns" north from the "Oval Plaza" while stepping over the tracks of chariot wheels still visible in the paving stones. Continue on to Amman. Overnight in Amman

Apr 07 AMMAN – MADABA – KERAK - PETRA

After breakfast enjoy a panoramic tour of Amman before beginning the trip south along the 5,000-year-old King's Highway, one of the most memorable journeys in the Holy Land, passing through a string of ancient sites. The first city you pass will be Madaba (Saint George's Church) "the City of Mosaics". Ten minutes to the west is the most revered site in Jordan: Mount Nebo, the memorial of Moses, the presumed site of the prophet's death and burial place. A small, square church was built on the spot by early Byzantine Christians and later expanded into a vast complex. Continue further south to Kerak, famous for its crusader fortress with underground galleries, rooms and secret passageways and its thick defensive walls pierced by narrow arrow slits where crusader archers held out bravely but in vain for over 100 years. It was the crusaders who made Kerak famous. The fortress was built in 1142 by Payen Le Boutellier, the lord of Montreal. He made Kerak the new capital of the province because it was situated on the king's highway, where it could control all traffic from north and south. On arrival at Wadi Musa, check in to the hotel. Overnight at Petra

Apr 08 PETRA

Spend a full day visiting the many sites of Petra; carved into the rose-red Sharah Mountains by the Nabateans and lost to Civilization until re-discovered by the Swiss Burkhardt. Around 11,000 BC Stone Age man was already exploiting the abundant natural resources of the Petra region, particularly wild goats and by 7000 BC some of the world's earliest farmers were living in a walled village at Beidha, cultivating cereals and collecting nuts and fruits. But Petra really came to prominence in the 7C BC when the Edomites settled on Umm al-Biyara and other mountain strongholds and built a town at Tawilan above 'Ain Musa, in the hills to the north. Subject to Assyria, Babylonia, and then Persia, Edom in the 3C BC became the nucleus of an Arab state, the Nabateans kingdom and its capital at Petra. Originally from North Arabia, the Nabateans are first mentioned by the 1C BC historian Diodorus, who relates that in 312 BC Antigonus, the One-Eyed sent his general Athenaeus against 'the land of the Arabs who are called Nabateans', at that time a nomadic people who raised cattle and sheep and could survive for long periods in the desert, where they created a network of secret underground reservoirs. Athenaeus attacked a certain strong, though un-walled rock, perhaps the great massif of Umm al-Biyara at Petra, where the Nabateans had left their valuables, elders, women and children while celebrating a festival, killed some of the Arabs there and made off with vast quantities of frankincense, myrrh and silver. Some 150 years later the Nabateans had settled, and Petra was the capital of an organized state. Walk through the Siq, a narrow and winding fissure between the cliffs, to reach the Treasury, the Roman Theater, the Courts, Qasr Bint Pharaoun, Temple of the Winged Lion and other monuments. Overnight in Petra

Apr 09 PETRA – AMMAN

After breakfast, depart for Wadi Rum for a 1.5-hour Bedouin jeep ride. Stunning in its natural beauty, Wadi Rum epitomizes the romance of the desert. With its "moonscape" of ancient valleys and towering sandstone mountains rising out of the sand, Wadi Rum is also home to several Bedouin tribes who live in scattered camps throughout the area. Climbers are especially attracted to Wadi Rum because of its sheer granite and sandstone cliffs, while hikers enjoy its vast empty spaces. Wadi Rum is probably best known because of its connection with the enigmatic British officer T.E. Lawrence, who was based here during the Great Arab Revolt of 1917-18. Much of David Lean's Lawrence of Arabia was filmed in Wadi Rum. Afterwards you will be transferred back to



Amman to check in to the hotel with time to rest and shower before being transferred late tonight to Queen Alia International Airport to check in for your flight home.

Apr 10 AMMAN

Your flight departs very early this morning back home.
