

PRAISE 106.5 Concert in the Park 2019
FAQs and Event Policies

When is the event?

Saturday, July 13, 2019 from 4:00 – 8:00 PM. Food and activities, open at 4:00 and music starts at 5:30.

Admission is free?

Yes! This is a FREE event for PRAISE 106.5 listeners and the general public.

Are tickets required?

No.

Where is it?

On the Barkley Village Green, directly outside of the PRAISE 106.5 Offices, located at:
2215 Rimland Drive, Bellingham WA, 98226

Sorry, PRAISE cannot offer station tours at this time. The office buildings will be closed to the public.

Where do I park?

There is free parking in the large paved lots directly NORTH of the park. *Please enter this area from Woburn Street, and turn East on Burns Street.* There will be large flags and signage directing you into the parking area from Woburn Street.

Is there reserved seating?

No. This is general seating and is open to the public. There are no reserved seats and chairs are not provided. **THE PARK WILL NOT BE OPEN FOR SEATING UNTIL 3:30 PM.** Early arrivers will be turned away.

You are welcome to bring a blanket or low back/beach style folding chair, keeping in mind:

- Blankets should be no more than 5' wide or long.
- Chairs must be low-back/beach style chairs only
- Depending on attendance, we reserve the right to limit the footprint of your blanket to accommodate other guests.

Is there park access for disabled persons?

Yes, the park is wheelchair-accessible from the corners of the grassy area.

Are there restrooms on-site?

Yes. Outdoor portable toilets and a hand wash station will be provided for guests. The office buildings will be closed to the general public.

Are food or beverages available?

- Yes! There will be 3-4 food vendors offering a variety of entrees, snacks, desserts, and beverages for sale.
- There are also several quick-service restaurants and a grocery store close by if you want to buy food off-site.
- Please have U.S. Cash for any purchases from food vendors, although vendors some *may* accept cards or Canadian currency.

Can I bring my own food or beverages?

Yes, but large coolers and BBQs/grills are not allowed. See “General Event Policies” below for more details.

Is there a drinking water station available?

Sorry, drinking water is not provided. You can bring your own, or food vendors will have bottled water for sale.

Are the kids’ activities free?

PRAISE 106.5 is providing an inflatable bouncy house FREE of charge to kids ages 7 and younger. Parents will need to sign a liability waiver before kids can use the inflatables. There will be other free lawn games and activities to kids older than 7 years.

What happens if it rains? Is there shade?

The event will be held rain or shine. Umbrellas are allowed for rain only, and will be restricted to the back of the viewing areas. See “General Event Policies” below for more details.

This is in an open park with no overhead cover, and only limited shade. Please check the weather and plan accordingly. Sunscreen and hats are recommended for sunny weather. Rain jackets are recommended for rain.

Is there a baby changing area? Nursing area?

Sorry, those facilities are not available at this event.

Can I bring my dog?

Well-mannered dogs on leashes are welcome. Please be a responsible pet parent and keep them close to you at all times, and ensure they are not a distraction to other guests. Also, keep in mind there will be loud live music and lots of children.

For bathroom “duties,” take pets to the grassy area directly south (downhill) of the park, or to the gravel parking area in the Southeast corner. Ask a staff member if you need directions.

Will there be a “meet and greet”?

No. The main act will not be available for pictures or a meet and greet.

General Event Policies:

- No alcohol will be sold by food vendors, and is not allowed at the event.
- Smoking, smokeless tobacco, or vaping/e-cigarettes are NOT allowed in the park area. Smoking or vaping is only allowed in the North parking areas.
- No weapons of any kind are allowed.
- No BBQs, grills, or “tailgate” cooking allowed in the park or parking lots.
- Shelters, canopies, tents, and/or personal tables are not allowed in the park area.
- This is a family-friendly event. Guests are expected to be courteous and respectful to one another and conduct themselves in a proper manner.
