CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY FACTS

- More than 9,000 construction companies
- More than 44,000 employees (8% of the provincial workforce)
- More people work in construction than forestry, mining, oil, gas, and transportation combined
- Second highest paying private sector employer
- 94% of companies have 20 or fewer employees
- Construction accounts for 7% of provincial GDP, more than manufacturing.



#1 - SUPPORT LOCAL

ENHANCE THE SUCCESS OF LOCAL VENDORS WHILE REMAINING INSIDE THE PARAMETERS OF THE TRADE AGREEMENTS THAT SK IS BOUND BY.

- 1. Require COR safety certification for all contractors
- 2. Require membership in a local construction association for all contractors
- 3. Require an after-action reporting function every time a non-Saskatchewan company is awarded a contract
- 4. Frame procurement as a local economic development process
- 5. Consider the economic development impacts of selecting different vendors; and
- 6. Invest in building relationships with local vendors.



#2 - GET PROMPT PAYMENT DONE RIGHT

- Bring Prompt Payment into force no later than April 1, 2021; and
- 2. Remove all exemptions to Prompt Payment.



#3 - GROWTH AND INVESTMENT ATTRACTION

- Commit to an independent tax and regulatory review with goal of making SK the most competitive jurisdiction in Canada for investment;
- 2. Invest more in the selling of SK opportunities to SK people and businesses;
- 3. Commit to updating the Growth Plan for the post-COVID world; and
- 4. Take a stand against municipal regulatory barriers and impediments to growth.



#4 - BEST VALUE PROCUREMENT

- Mandate that all taxpayer funded or supported organizations must adopt procurement practices consistent with the industry/SaskBuilds endorsed best value procurement approach;
- 2. Support the training of industry and other public agencies to ensure that good practices are well understood and adopted consistently; and
- 3. Establish an internal accountability function that enables vendors to raise concerns about procurement practices across all public agencies and have them addressed in a consistent manner.
