

### Canada and Saskatchewan invest to upgrade drinking water and wastewater infrastructure

The Government of Canada is investing more than \$12.7 million in 4 projects under the Green Infrastructure Stream of the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program. The Government of Saskatchewan is contributing over \$10.8 million. Contributions by recipients toward their respective projects are \$7.7 million. In total, this represents a combined infrastructure investment of more than \$31.3 million. Funding recipients are responsible for any additional project costs.
