Family, friends say goodbye to owner of El Fiesta Ballroom

(Seguin) – Many of those in the music and entertainment industry are joining the Seguin community today as it says goodbye to Johnny "Mr. T" Trevino.

Trevino who over the years has become synonymous with the El Fiesta Ballroom died last week after losing a long battle to Parkinson's Disease. Over the past 45 years, Trevino along with his wife Janie, have owned and operated the local dance hall on Interstate 10.

Throughout that time, the El Fiesta has hosted hundreds if not thousands of celebrities, comedians, wrestlers, and musicians all featuring various genres. Thanks to Trevino's vision, the ballroom has also become a mecca especially for those in the Tejano music

industry. In between the concerts and dances, the El Fiesta has also continued to operate as a reception hall, bingo hall, and even as a restaurant, hosting the location for The Lunch Box.

Daughter Lydia Trevino-Ruiz says the El Fiesta has always been her father's dream.

"That's what we want people to remember is he believed in education. He helped causes that promoted education and he was always there to sponsor sports teams for kids. He just did so much for so many people in the community and I think the biggest legacy that he could leave is that he loved the Fiesta Ballroom," said Lydia.

"He loved what it represented in the community, and he loved all the lives that it touched. So many people have been leaving messages, 'oh, we got married there. Oh, I met my husband there.' Forty-five years of events for a family so we literally shared in families' lives."

She says her father took pride in operating the El Fiesta – something she says made people come back again and again.

"I think it was that when they got here, they felt welcomed. They felt part of the family - (it wasn't) just come and play and thank you and goodbye. You got to know us. You got to know my dad. My dad was known for always walking around, making sure that everybody was behaving, not causing any trouble, making sure everybody was safe so that's why people came back over and over and since, we are a music venue and not a night club, you could bring family. You didn't have to be 21 years and older to enter and he always wanted to keep it that way. He was adamant, 'no, this is a family place. Families are welcome and we are not changing.' Yes, you can make more money doing all those better things but that's not what he was about," said Lydia.

Lydia says her father was a humble man who always quietly but passionately helped others follow their own dreams. She says he was the person who they will always remember as helping them getting that one foot in the door and that's by offering them the stage at the El Fiesta.

She says it was his personality and character that always made others feel at home such as in the family's story told about the late Selena Quintanilla.

"We talked to Mr. (Abraham) Quintanilla, Selena's father, because she played here when she was 9-years-old. She came and played here and throughout the years and so when we talked to Mr. Quintanilla, he was saying how sorry he was and he appreciated all of the support that we gave her from the very beginning and the last time, she performed here which was in December and the next year, she got murdered. She was in the office at the end of the evening, and we were talking, and she runs in – no make-up, in sweats and she runs in and she says 'dad, we "Rest in peace my amigo "enjoy the fiesta in heaven."



are taking off to San Antonio. So, her and her husband and her sister and her husband were going back to San Antonio because they were staying at the Riverwalk. She says we are going ahead and leaving, and my dad says 'wait a minute, let me shake your hand. You are never going to play here again.' And all she said was "Why Mr. T? Why am I not going to play here again? Are you kicking me out?' And he said, 'no, because you are going to be a big star, so I want to shake your hand.' And she said, 'oh no, Mr. T don't worry. I will be back. I'm not going to forget where I came from,"' said Lydia.

Among the other celebrities sending their heartfelt condolences to the Trevino family is Tejano sensation Little Joe of Little Joe Y La Familia. Joe says he will never forget Trevino's friendship.

"Johnny Trevino built the Fiesta Ballroom in Seguin, Texas, one of the most popular ballrooms in Texas. We share a lot of history and I'd like to share some of it with you. The Fiesta Ballroom opened in February in 1976. I was given the honor to perform for the grand opening on Easter Sunday, April 1976. It was the first public event 45 years ago. My last performance at Fiesta Ballroom was October 2019 for my birthday and that was the last time I saw my friend Johnny Trevino. Rest in peace my amigo and enjoy the fiesta in heaven," said Little Joe.

Now while most will remember Trevino for his success in the entertainment industry, his daughters say they will miss him for being the family man that he was and for all the good wisdom he instilled in them. Lydia says her father was simply the best.

"He would make us laugh and play practical jokes on us. He was a lot of fun and he never judged anybody. He would always tell us 'Be kind to everybody you meet and you'll get it back tenfold' which we are," said Lydia.

On top of being a good father, Lydia says Trevino was an even better husband.


"They were always kissing, kissing, kissing and the thing that struck me, is as sick as he was on his death bed, the minute my mom walked in, he opened his eyes and reached out to kiss her and I was like 'oh, my God, he is still thinking of my mom."

The funeral for Trevino will be held today at Our Lady of Guadalupe Church. Trevino also leaves behind daughters, Barbara Trevino-Kuvet; Cynthia Trevino-Rangel; Betty Trevino-Barry and Lisa Trevino-Rudny.



Texas Lutheran Baseball places program-best four student-athletes on Academic All-District 1st Team



(Seguin) - Texas Lutheran Baseball placed a program-best four student-athletes on the CoSIDA Academic All-District® 8 First Team for NCAA Division III Baseball.

The four Bulldogs - pitcher Matthew Hickey, outfielder Tyler Cauley, outfielder Cullen Motsinger, and designated hitter Tyler Post - advance to the Academic All-America® national ballot. The previous high for most TLU Baseball players on the Academic All-District First Team was three.

The 2020-21 Academic All-District® Baseball Team, selected by CoSIDA, recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the field and in the classroom. The CoSIDA Academic All-America® program separately recognizes baseball honorees in four divisions — NCAA Division I, NCAA Division II, NCAA Division III and NAIA.

First Team Academic All-District[®] honorees advance to the CoSIDA Academic All-America[®] ballot. First, Second, and Third Team Academic All-America[®] honorees will be announced in late July.

All four Bulldogs were members of TLU's 2021 Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference Championship Team. The SCAC Championship qualified TLU for the 2021 NCAA Division III Baseball Championship - Whitewater, Wis. Regional. The Bulldogs were 30-14 overall and 15-3 in the SCAC. TLU went 2-2 and finished third at the sixteam Whitewater Regional

national ballot for the first time. A junior academically and a sophomore athletically, Hickey holds a 3.92 grade point average as a kinesiology major.

Hickey was 3-1 with a 4.08 ERA in 39-2/3 innings pitched. He struck out 42 and walked 20.

Cauley is on the national ballot for a third time. A 2020 Academic All-American, Cauley made his third Academic All-District First Team. A May graduate of TLU, Cauley earned his bachelor's degree in business administration and his master's degree in accountancy. He held a 3.59 GPA in his undergraduate studies and a 3.50 GPA in graduate-level courses.

The SCAC Offensive Player of the Year in 2021, Cauley was a First Team All-West Region selection by D3baseball.com and a Second Team All-West Region

selection by the American Baseball Coaches Association. He also was named the SCAC's Elite 19 award winner for baseball. The award recognizes the top student-athlete at each of the 19 SCAC Championships.

This past season, Cauley hit .314 with a career-high 13 home runs. He drove in 48 and scored 43 runs. He also had eight doubles and one triple. Cauley finished his Bulldog career in the university's top-three all-time for home runs (41) and RBIs (199). He had career numbers of .339 for batting average, .455 for on-base percentage, and .646 for slugging percentage.

Motsinger, the 2019 SCAC Elite 19 award winner, also graduated from TLU in May. He also earned a bachelor's degree in business administration and a master's degree in accountancy. Motsinger posted an undergrad GPA of 3.63 and a 3.44 GPA for graduate-level courses.

Motsinger, a three-year starter in center field and the 2019 ABCA/Rawlings Gold Glove winner in the outfield, hit .356 this season with eight doubles, four triples and a home run. He scored 38 runs and walked 31 times. He stole 10 bases.

Post, a sophomore academically and

a second-year freshman athletically, was a First Team All-SCAC selection and a First Team All-West Region choice by the ABCA. As a mathematics major, Post holds a 3.47 GPA.

Post hit 11 home runs and had 13 doubles this season. He hit .336 and drove in 41. He has 14 career home runs in 54 career games. Post recorded an on-base percentage of .438 and a slugging percentage of .638 in 2021.



Donna Miller Wiehe was born January 22, 1930 in Ft. Worth, Texas. Donna's mother, Ottney Lee Weir, was married to Gaither Miller, who adopted Donna at an early age. They made their home in the Texas oil fields in Crane County. Gaither worked drilling oil wells for Cities Service Oil Company. Her mother worked many years as a county clerk and later in the school tax office. Donna studied piano with Lady Faye Galloway and oboe and percussion with Jacques Nance and Jim Nevins. She attended the Texas Tech

band camps in Lubbock for three summers while in junior high and high school.

In 1947, Donna earned a music scholarship to North Texas State University (now UNT). Donna's college degrees were Bachelor of Music Education and Master of Music Education. Later she earned a second Master of Education concentrating in special education. Donna was certified to teach all levels of music in band, choir and orchestra. While at NTSU, Donna played oboe in the band and orchestra. During football season, she played snare drum in a previously all-male drum line under the direction of Professor Maurice McAdow. She also played oboe with the Wichita Falls Symphony. After graduating Donna taught music in the Highland Park schools in Dallas.

Doug and Donna were married in 1951 and moved to Beeville, Texas where Doug accepted a position teaching JH/HS band. Donna taught elementary music and played English Horn with the Corpus Christi Symphony.

After Beeville, Donna and Doug taught in Big Spring ISD for nine years. She also played oboe with the Midland / Odessa Symphony.

When Doug was hired as a professor/band director at NTSU Donna taught junior high English, choir and orchestra in the Denton ISD schools. While Donna was Congress Junior High's orchestra director and Lida Beasley was Congress Junior High's band director they earned UIL first divisions. This made them the first female duo to do so at this school. Also, while in Denton, Donna typed over thirty theses and dissertations at NTSU and Texas Women's University to support her family while Douglas completed his PhD residency at the University of Oklahoma.

In 1971, Douglas and Donna moved to San Marcos where Douglas was the director of bands at Southwest Texas State University (now Texas State). Donna taught music and special education in the San Marcos public schools.

In 1974, Doug was hired as Fine Arts Supervisor for the Brazosport Independent School District. Donna taught special education, band, and elementary music. She also accompanied hundreds of students for UIL solo and ensemble competitions. Additionally, Donna was active as an oboist with the Brazosport Symphony of which she was a founding member in 1982.

After retiring from the public schools, Doug and Donna moved to Seguin, Texas. While in Seguin, they performed for three years with the San Antonio Concert Band (later called The Heart of Texas Concert Band) under the direction of Dr. Mark Rogers. During this time Donna also worked with the children's choir at Hillcrest Church and taught several students private piano and percussion.

Donna's first son, Stephen Douglas was born in Beeville and now lives in Pflugerville with his wife Sue. After moving to Big Spring their second son, Donald Kirk was born and now lives in Houston with his wife Beth. Five years later Angela was born and now lives in Austin with her husband Mark.







Death Toll Rises In Northwest Heat Wave

(Undated) -- The death toll is rising from the historic heat wave in the Pacific Northwest. The state of Oregon says 63 deaths are being linked to the heat wave, including 45 in the Portland area. Further north in British Columbia, the Canadian Coroner's Service said Wednesday at least 486 sudden deaths have been linked to the heat wave. Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau [[true-DOH]] said we've been seeing more and more of this type of extreme weather in the past years, and warned, "this heatwave won't be the last."

Pittsburgh Reports Nation's First **Case Of Rare Diagnosis In Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine Patient**

(Pittsburgh, PA) -- The nation's first reported case of a rare blood clotting diagnosis in a patient who received the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine is coming out of Pittsburgh. The Allegheny Health Network is confirming that a 65-year-old man passed away at West Penn Hospital in the Bloomfield neighborhood after he was diagnosed with the rare syndrome. Officials say the man received his second dose of the Moderna vaccine within ten days of going to the hospital.

CNN: All 50 States Have COVID Delta New Mental Health Bill Variant Named After Iowa Veteran

(Washington, DC) -- The COVID-19 Delta variant has now been detected in all 50 states. CNN says the 50th state to report the variant was South Dakota, which confirmed its first case on Tuesday. The CDC says the new variant is a more contagious strain of COVID-19, and accounted for over 26-percent of all cases as of Tuesday. Experts say most COVID vaccines are effective against the variant. The World Health Organization has urged those who are fully vaccinated to continue wearing masks to help slow the spread of the Delta variant.

(Washington, DC) -- A new mental health bill signed by President Biden is named after an Iowa veteran. Sergeant Brandon Ketchum of Davenport took his own life after being denied mental health help in 2016. The Sergeant Ketchum Rural Veterans' Mental Health Act will create new programs meant to increase access to mental healthcare in rural areas.
