The trees themselves, if they win the auction, they get to take that tree fully decorated home for them to enjoy or they can donate it back to the center and we will get it to a needy senior citizen who we happen to have Santa's good will notice that they don't have a Christmas tree in their house yet," said Layton.

Layton says the trees themselves are amazing and worth every bid that comes in.

"I believe there are seven or eight trees in the lobby - all different businesses have come in and decorated these lovely trees and put their names on them and everything from one that represents things all over Guadalupe County to a disco tree that is just the most unbelievable thing you have ever seen because it folds up into a three inch box when you are done at the end of the season without touching anything but the top of it and then one is a cactus - I mean it's fun. 

(Seguin) – After weeks of collecting toys and wrapping gifts, Seguin Police Department's Blue Santa is ready to distribute those gifts to local boys and girls.

Today and Friday marks distribution day for the Blue Santa Program. Pick up opportunities will be from noon to 7 p.m. each day.

Sarah Wallace, community engagement officer for the Seguin PD, says picking up gifts will be made easy.

"So, we just try to keep it as simple as possible for them this year. They don't need to bring any paper or any documents with them. All we need for them to remember is the name on the application and when in doubt, if they are not sure, the address of the application so if they can have the name on the application. Tivy's third quarter run too much for Seguin boys in district opening loss

(Seguin) - Kerrville-Tivy bracketed the third and fourth quarters of Tuesday's District 26-5A basketball opener with a 20-0 run to hand Seguin a 68-62 loss at Goldie Harris Gym.

After trailing 38-34 at halftime, the Matadors opened the third quarter with a 9-2 surge to take a 43-40 lead. The Antlers scored the final 17 points of the period and the first three of the fourth to build a 60-43 cushion.

Seguin kept fighting and used nine fourth quarter points from John Jackson to cut the deficit to six points in the final minute, but came no closer down the stretch. Head coach Guy Nowlin identified poor shot selection as the chief culprit of the Matadors' offensive dry spell in the second half.

"We've got to be patient, and not settle, because you're letting the other team off the hook defensively, and they don't have to work as hard," Nowlin said. "When we do get in our sets and get the ball moved, we're tough to stop, so we just need to keep hammering that with these guys, and hopefully they can stay consistent, so we can put four quarters together and beat quality teams here in district play."

Jackson led all scorers with 18 points. Jeffrey


Rodriguez added 16, and Devin Matthews reached double figures with 15.

Kevon Williams finished with seven points, John Jones and Jakyari Matthews three apiece.

Mason Carlile and Jaden Frausto paced Tivy with 17 points apiece. Robert Jackson and Quinten Vega contributed 12 and 10, respectively.

The loss snapped Seguin's four-game winning streak and dropped the team's overall record to 5-9.

The Matadors look to bounce back on Friday when they hit the road to face Buda-Johnson at 6:45 p.m.

Margo worked at the Seguin Hospital on Weinert St. for many years and became part of




as several other cousins, other loving family members and many friends and his beloved LoRetta.

It's the fifth time the high court has declined to block a COVID vaccine requirement in various parts of the U.S.

Italy Among Newest Countries Added To CDC List Of Highest Travel Risk

(Undated) -- The CDC is adding more countries to its highest-risk category for travel, and among the list is popular tourist destination Italy. Greenland and Mauritius were also added to the list in the agency's weekly update of travel advisories. The CDC normally adds nations to the highest risk Level Four category when there are more than 500 cases per 100-thousand residents in the last four weeks. Italy joins France and Portugal on the CDC's highest risk locations to travel, as those two European countries were added to the list last week.

Mask Mandate Is A 'Penalty Box,' Says Sununu



Appearing on CBS' Face The Nation, the New Hampshire governor said a state-wide mask mandate was essentially a punishment for people who have done all the right things to protect against COVID-19, like getting vaccinated and boosted. Sununu was also confident that residents were not getting confused over his administration's encouragement to take preventative action against COVID-19, despite New Hampshire's intention to fight the federal vaccine mandate. Sununu also pushed for the increased availability for home testing to cut down on community transmission.

(Washington, DC) -- Dr. Anthony Fauci is denying a critique from the WHO that pushing boosters will increase vaccine inequality with developing countries. Appearing On ABC's This Week, the White House chief medical advisor said it's possible to immunize your own people and still get vaccines out to lower income countries. Fauci added the U.S. has donated more vaccines worldwide than all other countries combined at over 300-million doses in over 100 countries. In the long term, the U.S. has pledged one-point-one billion doses of COVID-19 vaccines to countries in need.
