Remodel project ignites new life for one local fire house

City of Seguin rededicates Central Fire Station

(Seguin) -- A 75-year-old fire house in Seguin has a hot new look. The firefighting community gathered Wednesday afternoon with members of the public to rededicate the new and improved Central Fire Station located at 110 Elm St.

After eight months of being out of service, the contractors finally turned over the keys for the fire house which has undergone \$2.4 million in improvements.

Those improvements include a complete makeover of the first floor and a total remodel of second floor living quarters, including the addition of a large commercial-grade kitchen area.

Additional renovations

include the installation of a new HVAC system for each sleeping quarter so that they can each have control over their own heating and cooling. The remodel also adds six bathrooms plus plumbing and electrical systems throughout the facility.

Curtains open for Matador theater production “Into the Woods”

(Seguin) – A twist of classic fairy tale characters comes to life in this weekend’s Seguin High School’s Matador Theater production of “Into the Woods” by James Lapine.

SHS drama students are inviting the public to make plans to catch one of three productions scheduled for this weekend at the Seguin Performing Arts Center.

Into the Woods is described as a fairy tale-themed musical about the “experiences of various characters in the woods, as they strive to get their wishes and deal with the consequences of those wishes.”

Among those taking the stage is Senior Leo DeLeon who portrays the character, The Baker. DeLeon says the storybook musical again is a culmination of events that folks often have to endure in life while working toward a goal.

“The production is about finding your wish and achieving your lifetime goals and coming together. There’s different fairy tales in this show as well like Rapunzel, Cinderella, Jack in the Bean Stalk, Little Red Riding Hood. I play The Baker and I have my wife and we more than anything in the world, we really want a child and my father died in a baking accident and he wanted me to have a child and we just failed to have a child for so long,” said DeLeon.

Sharing the stage with DeLeon, a.k.a. her husband is Junior Amanda Munoz. Munoz says the story is like no other and will keep the audience captivated.

“I play The Baker’s wife and I basically help him throughout the whole journey because we both are aiming for the same wish. We both want a child, and we have to work together. It’s a little rough at first. We argue but eventually, we come together, and we figure

it out together. We go through the whole journey of finding these things that we need to get our wish and at the end when we do get our wish, we are happy and then all these bad things start happening. I cheat on my husband. I also die but at the end, I am still.... it’s like a story that we all go through different experiences and we all have to work together to get our main goal or our main wish. It’s a very complex story but I think we’ve done a really good job at making it happen and telling the stories the way they are supposed to be told,” said Munoz.

(Seguin) – The Seguin ISD wants you to go fly a kite this weekend. The school district is inviting the Seguin ISD community to its inaugural Kite Festival this Saturday from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. at Manuel Castilla Park.

Sean Hoffmann, the chief communications officer for the Seguin ISD, says the district is excited about partnering up with the Seguin Parks and Recreation Department to bring families this free event.

“We will have several hands-on activities for children of all ages including kite making and kite flying so we are hoping for a sunny, windy day on Saturday so our students can try their kites and get them up in the air. In addition to that, there will be free food and community vendors. Several sponsors on hand promoting health and awareness activities. This coming May is Mental Health Awareness Month, and we are kind of kicking that off with this event and asking the community to come out for a couple of hours and really take advantage of some of the opportunities and some of the vendors and sponsors on hand and have some fun. With COVID kind of being more and more in the background of our lives each day as we move forward and people able to get out and about in the community, we thought this would be a great spring weekend to host this event and invite our families to come out for some fun,” said Hoffmann.



Hoffmann says coming out and participating has been made easy.

“Our families can bring their own kites if they prefer to, or they can probably plan on making one there at the event. Bring chairs, blankets if they want to sit and hang out for a few hours or a few minutes whatever works best. We are just glad we are able to host this event right now and have the community come out,” said Hoffmann.

Impressed with the results was former Battalion Chief Rusty Krueger who retired in 2019 after serving the city for nearly 35 years.

Krueger says taking an older facility like this and making it almost brand new again is a wonderful thing. He says this project not only saves the community money, but it also ensures the safety of its firefighters.

“It’s wonderful. The main thing is the safety for the firefighters that have to work in this station because we were in an unsafe environment for many, many years having like one bathroom facility, one shower and that sort of thing. So, the upgrade is going to bring the morale up, number one. The citizens should be proud of what has been done. Our firefighters will be safe when they come back from a fire. They can actually get

into different showers and make sure the carcinogens are taken off their body which in the long run is going to save the city money because of health problems that

could be happening,” said Krueger.

Krueger says not only did he contribute input for the project, but he was grateful to see that the fire house has now been equipped to continue for another 50 years.

“I’m very impressed, yes, yes. For years and years, I’ve complained about we need to move forward and make this place a more modern facility and it’s happened and so it’s been great. I had just a little bit of a planning aspect right before I retired myself and Jimmy Vogel so it’s good to see that those plans that we put into it are actually there. It’s a cool thing,” said Krueger.

Among those joining the public in a tour of the newly upgraded facility was Judy MyCue Hyatt. For Hyatt, the project was extra special in that the fire house in 2001 was rededicated in memory of her father and former Seguin Fire Chief Roger C. MyCue.

Mid-Texas Symphony wraps up season with Sunday show at TLU

(Seguin) -- The Mid-Texas Symphony will present its final performance of its current season on Sunday in Jackson Auditorium at Texas Lutheran University.

MTS Conductor Akiko Fujimoto says the show will feature the Pines of Rome, which she describes as a barn burner, that will delight the audience.

“It is a study of the city of Rome, throughout history, from the perspective of the pine trees that are standing over the city in different iconic locations of the city. It’s got history. It’s got nature. It’s got, a kind of, spirituality. It has everything about it. It’s a very moving piece, and also very picturesque. You can just picture people and trees and catacombs. You can just picture things going on in the city of Rome,” said Fujimoto.

The performance will also feature guest artist, Rachel Cheung, an award winner from the 2017 Van Cliburn International Piano Competition. Fujimoto says Cheung is an amazing piano player who will help to bring to life an amazing piece written by Rachmaninoff.

“She is from the newest crop of prize winners, and we are very, very happy to get

her. Being an audience prize winner, means that she connected well with the audience (at the competition). She wasn’t just a virtuosic pianist, which she is. I think that’s sort of the model of the Mid-Texas Symphony. We want to play great music well, but we also really want to connect with our audience. That’s why we asked her (to perform), because we want somebody who is going to do that with our audience. I think she will do a great job playing Rachmaninoff’s Rhapsody on a Theme of Paganini,” said Fujimoto.

The final performance of the 2021-2022 season begins at 4 p.m. Sunday in Jackson Auditorium. Tickets are available online at mthsymphony.org, or by calling the Mid-Texas Symphony box office at 830-463-5353.

Hyatt says to see new life in a facility that operates in her father’s name is impressive and rewarding. She says she knows her father, who is also known for creating the volunteer system in the county, would have been proud of the project. She says the restoration of this building reflects the progress seen across the city.

“One thing, it’s a good sign that Seguin is growing. It’s healthy. It’s economically healthy. It’s got a good spirit about it. City committees work well, city committees with volunteered people. We have a good staff that is very capable, so I think it’s a mark on how

big the city is becoming, and we are rebuilding the infrastructure especially of the old places and this is certainly a good example of that,” said Hyatt.

Also included in the project was a new climate-controlled bunker gear room, a chair lift for access to the second floor; energy-efficient LED lighting throughout; bay area floors coated, and repainted walls plus exterior doors and the trim.

The fire station was originally built in 1947. Since that time, it has only undergone two smaller renovations. Overseeing this project for the Seguin Fire Department were TSG Architects and the Koehler Company.

Portraying the character Cinderella is Junior Aly Burns. Burns says although the production was delayed earlier this year due to COVID-19, the cast and crew has produced one of its best productions yet.

“I think everybody is really hardworking and determined like spent their time making sure this is perfect. I know when it got delayed, everybody was a little let down, but it just made our passion for it even greater, wanting it to be better than how we left it and I think it’s really come together in a very special way. I would just encourage people to come see it. The set is really really amazing, costumes are great, actors are great. It’s going to be good,” said Burns.

Proud of what they have been able to

accomplish is Theater Teacher Lydia Robles. Robles says this cast and crew of 30 to 35 students have yet again raised the bar when it comes to talent. She says the community will not want to miss this experience.

“While there are fairy tale characters in this show and younger audiences can enjoy that, it truly is an adult theme, an adult story. We are telling the story of I think the modern-day person even though it’s a fairy tale, we still relate to these characters. A modern day person trying to achieve their goal, their dream – something better than what they have right now and it’s a first act of comedy but it is a second act of tragedy and how these characters that are left in the end, pull together to redefine and reignite what their happy is, what their good is at the end of the show because it looks

very different than when they started off at the beginning – beautiful songs, ballads, hysterical comedy mixed in there with the step-mother and the step-daughters and the witch and the wolf who wants to eat a young girl. It’s got all these fun elements mixed in with all of these more serious elements that adults can relate to. So, it’s one that you have to have that right concoction of students to tackle this sort of project because they wanted it and they were willing, we stepped up to the plate,” said Robles.

Show times are at 7 p.m. Friday and Saturday and 3 p.m. Sunday. Pre-sale tickets are \$12 for adults and \$8 for students. Tickets at the door are \$15 for adults and \$10 for students. Pre-sale tickets are available at Gift & Gourmet and Keepers Interiors.

TLU win streak ends at 14, edged by UMHB 6-5

(Belton) - The No. 25 ranked Texas Lutheran baseball team fell for the first time since March 19 and saw a 14-game winning streak end Tuesday night in a 6-5 loss to Mary Hardin-Baylor at Red Murff Field in Belton.

Former Seguin High School standout Robert McCall, who transferred to UMHB from TLU, hit the walk-off sacrifice fly in the bottom of the ninth inning. He also hit his second home run of the season in the first. Recent Navarro graduate Sam Muniga started at shortstop for the Crusaders.

Mary Hardin-Baylor stuck first scoring three runs on two home runs in the bottom of the first to jump out to a 3-0 lead.

Texas Lutheran responded with a run in the second and added two more in the third to tie the game 3-3 - highlighted by an RBI single from Alec Sanchez and a sacrifice fly from Joe Jimenez.

UMHB scratched a run across in the bottom of the third with a solo

homer to regain a 4-3 lead.

Texas Lutheran would score two runs in the fifth to take a 5-4 lead entering the bottom of the fifth. UMHB would hit yet another home run in the bottom of the fifth to tie the game 5-all - where the game would remain until the bottom of the ninth.

The Texas Lutheran pitching staff struck out nine batters in total. Blake Cappadona punched out six hitters in his three and two-thirds innings of work in relief.

Up next, No. 25 Texas Lutheran will face off against the No. 17 Trinity Tigers in a battle for first place in the SCAC.

The Bulldogs will face the Tigers in a three-day, three game weekend series April 22-24, all under the lights at the Trinity Baseball Field. First pitch is scheduled for 7 PM on Friday, as well as on Saturday and Sunday. All streaming and live stats links can be found on tlubulldogs.com.

TLU's Kelly Jurden named SCAC Hitter of the Week

(Seguin) - For the fifth time in her career, Texas Lutheran senior Kelly Jurden has been named Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference (SCAC) Hitter of the Week for her performances against University of Dallas, the conference announced late Monday night. This is Texas Lutheran's fifth SCAC Hitter of the Week honor this season.

The reigning SCAC Offensive Player of the Year and NCAA Division-III All-Time Stolen Base Leader had an outstanding weekend maintaining a .500 batting average, driving in four runs, scoring six runs, and stealing eight bases. She now has 56 stolen bases on the season, which leads all of Division-III and is tied for the second-highest single season total in league history behind her own record of 61 stolen bases set in 2019.

Jurden currently leads the SCAC in

stolen bases, runs scored (37), and walks (21). Jurden is nine walks away from matching her own single-season record of 30 walks set just last season and six hits away from matching Ashley Jacobsen (2012-15) for the TLU softball All-Time hits record (246). She set the new TLU career at-bats record over the weekend with 574 career at-bats through last weekend.

No. 3 Texas Lutheran meets Trinity University to close the regular season at Ed Kruse Stadium, April 22-23. The teams play at 5 PM and 7 PM on Friday and 12 and 2 PM on Saturday with the 2 PM game serving as a JV game. The Bulldogs will honor their four seniors (Casey Martin, Chassety Raines, Sarah Metzger, and Jurden) on Saturday for Senior Day. Wills runner-up after record setting day, Bulldogs finish third at SCAC Championships

(Blanco) - Following 54 holes at the SCAC Championships, the Texas Lutheran men's golf team finished third at the SCAC Championships at the par-72 Vaaler Creek Golf Club.

The Bulldogs placed a pair of golfers on the all-tournament team as freshman Tobey Wills finished tied for first before falling on the third playoff hole to medalist Christian Rodriguez of Southwestern. Chase Maus was also named to the All-Tournament team as an honorable mention finishing tied for 15th. Texas Lutheran shot the low round of Tuesday of 293. Texas Lutheran would finish with a final score of 901 with Southwestern winning the tournament with an 889 score.

Wills (-4, 2nd) paced the Bulldogs across all three rounds, posting a 212 4-under-par to finish tied for first before falling in the playoff. The 54-hole score of 212 is the third-lowest all-time at the SCAC Championships and only second to Colin Uecker's 211 in 2019 in TLU

Men's Golf history since joining the SCAC. Wills shot the low-round of 66 in round three on Tuesday - the lowest third round score in SCAC history. The three-hole playoff is also the longest in SCAC Championship history.

Maus (+13, T-15) posted a 2-over-72 on Tuesday to jump six spots on the leaderboard to join Wills in the top fifteen finishing the tournament 13-over-par.

Matthew McArthur finished in a tie for 20th after firing a 234 (+18) for the Bulldogs over the two-day championship.

Cameron Carter (+19, T-23) closed his tournament with an 11-over 83 to finish tied for 23rd. Chandler Otto and Caleb Kruse would have their best rounds of the tournament on Tuesday. Otto would sign for 2-over 74 to rise five spots to finish tied for 28th with a 54-hole score of 240. Kruse shot a 7-over 79 in his final round to rise three spots and finish 36th with a final tally of 250.

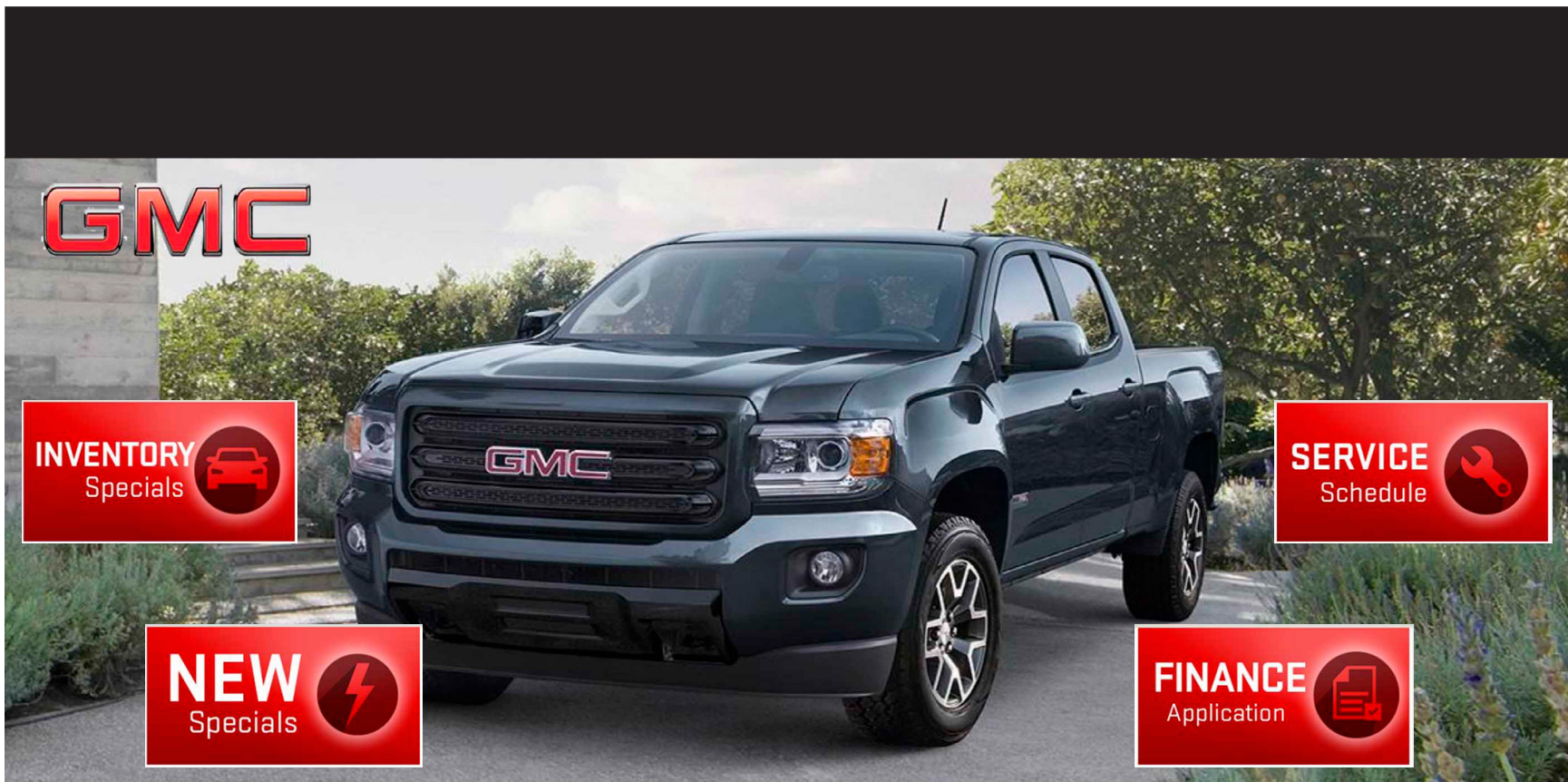

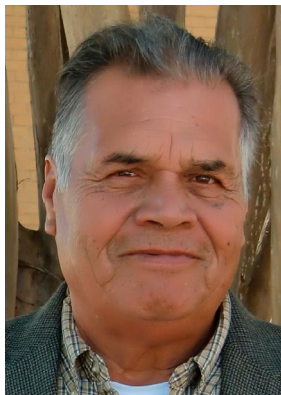

Justice Department Appeals Mask Mandate Ruling

(Washington, DC) -- The Justice Department is officially appealing the ruling to strike down the federal mass transit mask requirement. The DOJ announced the move in a statement late Wednesday. It comes after the CDC released its own statement saying they believe the mask mandate is still "necessary for the public health." A federal judge in Florida overturned the mandate Monday, saying the CDC was overstepping its authority.

Three Sailors Die Within A Week On the Same Carrier

(Newport News, VA) -- Three U.S. sailors who served on the same aircraft carrier have died within a week. Military officials said Tuesday a sailor was found unresponsive on board the USS George Washington this past Friday as the carrier was being overhauled in Newport News, Virginia. Earlier this month, two other sailors were found dead on the same carrier in separate incidents. Officials say there are no immediate signs that the deaths are connected. The Navy says it's cooperating with NCIS in their investigation.

Zucchini Sold At Walmart Recalled

(Bentonville, AR) -- Zucchini sold at Walmart is being recalled. The FDA says zucchini sold in 18 states is being recalled because of possible salmonella contamination. The Organic Marketside Zucchini was sold in two-count packages and sold in states across the Midwest, South, and the Western U.S. No illnesses have been reported due to the affected zucchini. The FDA says you should destroy or dispose of the product if you have purchased it.

Feds: Americans Often Forced To Pay For Medical Bills They Don't Actually Owe

(Washington, DC) -- Medical bills are sky high as it is, but a new federal report says many Americans are having to pay for bills they have already paid or don't actually owe. The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau report found people's most common debt collection complaint last year were related to efforts to collect on a bill they said did not belong to them. The agency noted these bills often end up on people's credit reports and force them to go through many hoops to try and clear their financial record. Federal data shows roughly one in every five American carry healthcare-related debt, and the CFPB says it sent out more than 750-thousand complaints to about 34-hundred companies in 2021.
