The MATADOR Walk

SHS seniors return to elementary schools where it all began

(Seguin) -- There is a Matador tradition here in Seguin beloved by locals. In the days leading up to graduation, seniors return to the elementary schools where their education began. Dressed in full commencement regalia from caps and gowns to cords and stoles, seniors walk the halls as they endure the cheers from elementary school students, parents, and teachers.

On Thursday, following their senior photo at Matador Stadium, students loaded up on buses and headed to their former elementary schools. Taking a walk down memory lane at McQueeney Elementary School were Kevin Blake and Deantre Grant. They were high-fiving kids when their walk came to a halt at the sight of a familiar face.

"This is Ms. Castillo," Blake said. "She taught

me — it was like music reconnaissance something where learned a bunch of types of music and recited it back what era it was from and who the composer was. She started my music journey. I was on varsity choir for four years."

Music teacher Amy Castillo and her former students shared hugs that brought smiles and tears. And then there was laughter as Castillo shared

her memories of Blake in class

"He was challenging, like they all are, but he was great," Castillo said. "All the seniors were great. I saw him in sixth grade on stage, and that's one thing I told them — keep going, you can accomplish your dreams, and just go for it."

Grant is a member of the NJROTC and was this year's commanding officer. While he had many memories from Castillo's

class, one stood out from the rest - playing the recorder.

"I know that the thing I remember was us playing recorders," Grant said. "She was teaching us how to play A, B, C and then F, A, C, E."

And though elementary school was a long time ago for these soon-to-be graduates, they still have a few mementos from back then lying around.

"I still have my recorder," Blake said. "I played it like two years ago!"

Like McQueeney, Rodriguez Elementary School also got welcome graduates back onto campus. Not only did they get to stroll its hallways, but they led the way for the fifth graders who followed immediately behind for their own final walk around the campus.

(Seguin) - Graduation Day has arrived for Seguin High School. Seguin High School this Friday night will be presenting its latest batch of graduates at Matador Stadium.

Honored to return traditional and safe ceremony to the community is SHS Assistant Principal Ryan Randolph. Randolph says after some very challenging years, this group of graduates should be commended for working harder than most.

"We are graduating right at about 475 students, so we are really excited to do that with these kids in the traditional format this year. These guys have been through a lot. Their sophomore year is when everything shut down with COVID and then last year as a junior, some of these kids did their work remotely. Some of these kids were here face to face. Some went back and forth with that. So, for them to go through the last two years with the struggles they had that were unprecedented in education and make it across the stage this year is outstanding, and it speaks a lot to the character of these students," said Randolph.

With those challenges behind them, Randolph says the tradition of graduation in Seguin returns full force.

"This year, we are back to the way it was pre-COVID so it's open for all family members to be able to participate and be here for graduation. We did have it on the field last year. The year before, we had to limit it a lot. Last year, we had to limit it a little bit but this year, we are open and back to normal," said Randolph.

Now although it is a night of celebration, Randolph is warning family and friends of some policies that have been put into place to ensure that every name is heard, and every student is seen.

"Both sides will be open. Dos and Don'ts, be here to celebrate with your kid. No posters, noisemakers to make sure that everybody can see their kid walk across the stage, no big balloons. Nothing that can block the view of anybody else. No loud noisemaker that is going to prevent anybody from hearing their kids name called because it's a celebration for all students. Any

of that kind of stuff keep in the car. You can celebrate with your kid once the ceremony is over. After the ceremony, the students as it has been traditionally, will come to the back to pick up all of their diplomas and the parents after the ceremony is over can take pictures with their students. But prior to the ceremony, no parents will be allowed on the field. It will just be the students," said Randolph.

Those attending are also reminded that flowers will not be allowed in the stadium and the district's clear bag policy will be enforced. There will also be an increased police presence throughout the ceremony. District wide staff members will also be monitoring the area.

The Seguin High School graduation ceremony is set for 8 p.m. Friday at Matador Stadium. A live stream of the ceremony will also be made available for those who cannot attend the event. Of course, when asked about whether it's been a competition between the two, Sam says it has been anything but a tug-a-war between the two.

I was born on April 27, 2004, and actually on our birth certificates, it says 4:31 p.m. for each of us so the same minute we were born so that's pretty interesting," said Sam. "It's definitely nice to have someone just to rely on because we live together and he's always around me. I can always know he's there for me."

This next chapter in life, however, will see the two young men head toward different paths. While Will studies at LSU, Sam be headed up the road to The University of Texas at Austin. There he will be participating in the Longhorn Marching Band while majoring in business.

Mike Wacker retires after 37 years of coaching

Texas Lutheran University to two Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference Championships and two NCAA Tournament appearances, is retiring after 37 seasons and 782 wins as a head basketball coach at the high school and collegiate level.

The legendary Texas coach concluded his sixth season as the Bulldogs head coach in March. In addition to SCAC Tournament Championships in 2017 and 2019, he led the Bulldogs to two NCAA Tournament appearances in 2017 and 2019.

Wacker announced his retirement in the following letter:

"Dear Coach Miller and the entire Bulldog community,

I have stepped down as the Head Men's basketball coach at Texas Lutheran

(Seguin) - Mike Wacker, who led University with my retirement as of May 31, 2022," stated Wacker.

> "This was not a recent or easy decision and I will be leaving with some sadness.

My health has deteriorated, with extreme neuropathy in my feet and progressing neuropathy in my hands. It has been an honor and a privilege to serve our student athletes in the TLU Men's basketball program while being part of the larger TLU community.

To have been the leader of the TLU Men's Basketball program for the last six years is an honor I will long be proud of and I have greatly appreciated the tremendous support given to me. I want to personally thank our Athletic Director Bill Miller, President Cottrell and former President Dorsey for believing in me.



WHO: Monkeypox Cases Up To 550 Worldwide

(Geneva) -- More cases of monkeypox are being reported worldwide. The World Health Organization said on Tuesday that over 550 monkeypox cases have now been reported in 30 countries. WHO official Rosamund Lewis told CNN that "what we're seeing now is really quite different," because the outbreak is happening in many places at once in a relatively short period of time. The source of the outbreak is still unknown. The WHO is urging health care providers to watch closely for possible monkeypox symptoms, including rash, fever and swollen lymph nodes.

Pedestrian Deaths Hit Highest Number In U.S. In 40 Years

(Undated) -- Pedestrian deaths in the U.S. are at a 40-year high. A report from the Governors Highway Safety Association says nearly 75-hundred pedestrians were killed last year, up about 12 percent from 2020. The organization believes multiple factors contributed to the higher total, including dangerous driving and the lack of pedestrian infrastructure like sidewalks. It comes at the same time that roadway fatalities are also soaring, which Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg has called a "crisis."

Slower Gait From Year To Year May Be Early Dementia Sign

(New York, NY) -- A new study suggests that a slower gait from year to year may be an early dementia sign. Australian researchers studied 17-thousand people ages 65 and up in both Australia and the U.S. They found that those who walked five-percent slower a year while also showing slower mental processing were more likely to develop dementia. Dr. Joe Verghese, a neurology and geriatrics professor at Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York, says the study is the first to highlight the importance of gait dysfunction in the development of Alzheimer's disease.



Q: My house faces west. Some of the potted plants by the front door really look bad. Are there any plants that can stand the heat and the sun?

I have the same problem. My beautiful geranium looks almost cooked. (To solve that problem I moved it to the back door). Some plants will survive. The old fashioned periwinkle (vinca) does really well and comes in white, pink, deep pink, and almost purple. You can't go wrong with vinca. Zinnias do well and the butterflies like them. You can buy zinnia seeds for different heights, colors, and flower types. Personally I have no luck with marigolds. They always get spider mites. Portulaca and purslane are two more sun and heat tolerant plants.

If you are planting perennials, Hamelia patens (Firebush) does well although it freezes to the ground in the winter. Esperanza and lantana are two more heat and sun tolerant plants although both freeze back. To tell the truth, I like that in a plant. Once the frozen foliage is cut off, it's like you have a whole new plant each year. Salvias and verbena also do well here.

Q:I really like birds but they are pecking on my tomatoes. Suggestions?

Doug Welsh, an extension horticulturist, suggests that as soon as the bottom or blossom end of the tomato turns from green to white with a tinge of red, it is mature, and can be picked to ripen

indoors away from the birds. You could also use bird netting to protect your crops, but I have not had good luck. One year I covered my blueberries with netting. Hearing cries and shrieks I rushed out and found a hawk attacking a mockingbird that was caught in the netting. Very upsetting!

In this hot weather please remember to keep your bird baths full. I don't worry about feeding the birds because once the figs ripen there is enough fruit for everyone (including squirrels, possums, raccoons, etc.)

Q: Is there a way to conserve water and still have plants?

Mulch your flower beds, shrubs, vegetable gardens and around young fruit and shade trees. Welsh reminds us that mulch conserves water by reducing moisture evaporation from the soil surface. It also keeps soil temperature more moderate although I don't think that using the new black mulch is the way to go because it absorbs the heat. During a drought, raise the mowing height of your mower. The height for St. Augustine grass should be 4 inches or more. Height for Bermuda lawns is 2 inches, and for buffalo grass lawns, 6 inches. Also, do not over fertilize. Too much fertilizer causes excess growth. If you have an irrigation system, water the lawn and garden between sundown and sunrise because that is when the wind and temperatures are lower. I water about 4 in the morning so that the moisture doesn't sit on the leaves too long and cause fungal problems.
