

Shop Local, Shop Seguin Entities looking to keep your dollars in town this holiday season

Teachers get surprised with classroom grants

Seguin Education Foundation awards annual round of grants

(Seguin) – Before leaving campus for this week's Thanksgiving break, several teachers in the Seguin ISD received yet another reason to be thankful.

That's because several teachers across the district were surprised in their classrooms last week with a 2022 Seguin Education Foundation Grant. This particular round of grants totaled just over \$60,000.

Teachers were being surprised one by one with the news that the grant that they had submitted and worked so hard on was chosen to be funded by the foundation. Accompanying that news was a large check and the joyful sounds of the Seguin Matador Band that escorted SEF board members as they made their official "prize patrol" trek across the district.

Unable to fight back the tears as she learned the news was Science Teacher Sandra Torres, of Rodriguez Elementary School, who was awarded \$1,773.54 for her Observation Station Master's program.

"I'm so excited for science! I've ordered a weather station. I've ordered so many things - aprons, little supplies for the lab, posters to decorate. everything with the TEKS for science across the grade levels - a planet, solar system projector so they can actually experience the solar system in a classroom. There's just so many things that I was able to put on this list. There's a lot of things that the kids are going to be able to do with this and I'm working very closely with third, fourth and fifth graders and their teachers and just so excited for the potential that this has," said Torres.

Applying for an education grant was also the first time for Torres.

"It's the first grant that I ever applied for ever and I was so nervous, and I almost did not do it," said Torres.

She says although it was her name on the check, it's the students who are the real winners and encourages other teachers in the district to also give it a try next year.

"Just take your time. Write it all out. Put your feelings into it, what it means to you, what it means to the kids and go for it," said Torres.

Storefronts will also include new signage highlighting the holiday campaign. Smith says the groups chose to do away with those yellow and red posters – replacing them with red, white, and black posters – that contain a heart and that reads, "Shop Where Your Heart Is – Shop Local Shop Seguin."

"I think that if you love Seguin, you love your community, you have to spend where your heart is and that's why we decided with this because I think that if we love our community, we have to encourage everyone to spend their money here, but it is true. I've seen it. I've seen it for many years. I've been here for many years, and I continuously see that if we stay local as much as we can, it will help all of us," said Smith.

Also doing its part to encourage shopping in Seguin this holiday season is the Seguin Area Chamber of Commerce. President Chester Jenke says there's plenty of good reasons to keep your dollars local.

"Here's the top five reasons you should mark Shopping Small a priority. When you support a local business, you are also supporting your own town and city and a neighborhood. America's 33.2 million small businesses account for more than 99 percent of all U.S. companies who employ almost half of the private sector employees. Small businesses give back to their community. You see that on the back of Little League jerseys. Small businesses make it easier for you to shop with them and small businesses

offer one-of-a-kind items," said Jenke.

To help promote the effort, Jenke says the chamber features the uniqueness of many of its local businesses not only during the holiday season but all year long.

"If you follow our social media presence, you will see that we are highlighting different businesses in different months. This is Small Business Month and if you will for us, we'll have different small business every Monday, Wednesday, Friday for the next two weeks and then Monday, Wednesday, Friday all the way through that Christmas time to highlight somebody in the downtown area," said Jenke.

Applauding the annual effort to bridge all efforts is Kyle Kramm, the director of the Seguin Main Street and CVB.

"Seguin is very unique in the fact that it has the chamber, the Hispanic chamber, EDC and also Main Street and our Visitors Center all come together to promote the shopping local and shopping Seguin especially around the holiday time – trying to really push that message through. It's a very good partnership of the four or five entities that come together every year to really promote keeping your dollars here in Seguin and helping our mom-and-pop businesses," said Kramm.

SEF Executive Director Kelly Follis says that \$60,000 awarded to local teachers equaled to 22 grants across the district. She says although, they had \$130,000 worth of grant applications submitted, the foundation had to deny more than twice that amount.

"I thank so much the community for contributing to the Seguin Education Foundation and our board that is amazing and gets out there and works and raises funds, but we are stepping it up. The more funds we raise, the more grants that we can give and that's what we want to do because our teachers are just outstanding and it's so rewarding to go out and see their faces when you present them with a check, and they are not getting a check for themselves. They are getting a check so that they can do great things in our classrooms at the Seguin ISD, and we just want to do everything that we can to help with that and

we know our community does too," said Follis.

Seven Bulldogs Earn All-ASC Honors

SEGUIN, Texas -- Tight End Aaron Sotelo (Castroville/Medina Valley) was named to the All-ASC First Team, highlighting seven Bulldogs to earn All-ASC honors, as announced by the conference office on Thursday. Selections were made by the league's head coaches, who were not permitted to vote for their own players. Three Bulldogs were named to the All-ASC Third Team: Quarterback Seth Cosme (Angleton/Angleton) and running backs Jacob Forton (Spring Branch/ Smithson Valley) and DaKory Willis (Flatonia/Flatonia). Three Bulldogs were also named All-ASC Honorable Mention. Sotelo, a senior from Castroville, earned All-ASC honors for the third year in a row. 2022 marks his first First Team honor, earning honorable mention honors in 2020-21 and third team honors last season. Sotelo finished the season with 49 receptions for 497 yards and eight touchdowns. Sotelo finished fourth in the American Southwest Conference (ASC) in receptions and touchdowns despite only playing in nine of the Bulldogs 10 games.

Cosme, a senior from Angleton, earns his third career all-conference honor starting all 10 games for the Bulldogs at quarterback. Cosme was one of the most efficient quarterbacks in the country in 2022, finishing fourth in NCAA Division-III in completion percentage (.730). Cosme threw for 2,377 yards and 20 touchdowns while adding three rushing touchdowns on 57 yards rushing.

Forton, a junior from Spring Branch, earns his first career

conference honors following a season that saw the running back rush for 506 yards and 10 touchdowns, along with 332 yards receiving and three touchdowns. Forton led the American Southwest Conference in total touchdowns (13) and points (78) in 2022.

Willis, a junior from Flatonia, earned All-ASC Third Team honors at running back for the third year in a row. Willis finished second in rushing for Texas Lutheran with 383 yards and a touchdown. Willis finished the season with a career-high 144 yards receiving on 26

A trio of Bulldogs also earned honorable mention recognition at their respective positions: kicker Joaquin Rodriguez (San Antonio/ Smithson Valley), safety Mason Hardy (Flynn/Normangee), defensive back Khalen Wilkerson (Killeen/Ellison).

Junior Linebacker Caleb Giles (Houston/Lamar) was named to the ASC Outstanding Sportsman Team of the Year.

Texas Lutheran went 4-6 and 3-5 in the American Southwest Conference to finish 6th in the conference.



FDA: Rise In Child Poisonings Linked To Cough Medicine

(Silver Spring, MD) -- The FDA is warning about a link between a popular cough medicine and a dramatic increase in child poisonings. A study found a 158-percent increase in child poisonings over an eight-year period involving the prescription drug Tessalon. The capsules look like candy, which the FDA believes is adding to a rise in accidental poisonings, mainly among ten to 16-year-olds. The FDA is putting out the warning as the respiratory virus season is coming on, when kids' coughs and sniffles can turn into colds and the flu.

US Home Births Hit 30-Year High In 2021

(Atlanta, GA) -- More than 50-thousand American babies were born at home in 2021. Last year's total was 12-percent more than in 2020, following a 22-percent jump in home births from 2019 to 2020. It's also the highest level since at least 1990. In a report out today, the CDC says the surge in home births over the past two years corresponds "with the initial surge of COVID-19 cases in the United States." Home births still are rare in this country, accounting for just over one and-a-quarter percent of all births in the U.S. last year.

NYC Pharmacy Used COVID Pandemic For Money Laundering Scheme

(New York, NY) -- Two New York City pharmacy owners are admitting to taking advantage of the coronavirus pandemic to launder over 18-million dollars. Federal authorities say the owners took part in a complex scheme involving over a dozen New York-area pharmacies that they and their coconspirators owned. The pair submitted millions of dollars in fake claims to Medicare and used COVID-19 related "emergency overrides" to receive payouts, which they sent to shell companies that included sham pharmacy wholesale companies. They each face up to 20 years in prison when sentenced next year.

NJ Schools Will Keep Mental Health Counseling Programs

(Trenton, NJ) -- Governor Murphy is pressing pause on plans to eliminate mental health counseling in dozens of New Jersey schools. The governor told News 12 New Jersey that his administration will fund the programs that currently exist but also plans to cast a wider net when it comes to addressing mental health post-pandemic. He says a formal announcement will be coming soon. Murphy backpedaled on plans to get rid of mental health counseling in 90 schools after facing backlash from advocates for School-Based Youth Services.


