One of the co-coordinators of the run is also an employee.

Listeners call in to adopt a child and provide the needs and gifts of the child. Both drives have been successful and most importantly have helped families in our area during the winter months.

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POLAR PLUNGE FOR SPECIAL OLYMPICS

104.3 The Party once again participated in the Annual Law Enforcement Torch Run Polar Plunge for Special Olympics Illinois at Lake Sara in Effingham on February 16, 2019. Our team raised \$1,857 for the athletes. The grand total raised for Special Olympics Illinois Region I was over \$52,000! We worked behind the scenes with Region I Director, Vanessa Duncan, to plan the promoting of the Plunge. In addition to the Plunge team fundraising, they partnered with the Omega Nu Ladies for a bake sale. The Plunge team helped raise awareness and funds for such an amazing non-for-profit organization, which supports year round sports training and competitions for individuals with intellectual disabilities.







COUNTRY CARES FOR ST. JUDE KIDS RADIOTHON





Our annual Country Cares Radiothon, consisting of our morning team, Bub & Renee, work a 12-hour on-air shift for two days in effort to end childhood cancer once and for all. Local second graders provide the voices on poems written by actual St. Jude patients. More than \$131,000 was raised in twenty four hours proving once again that there's nothing live, local radio cannot do.

ONE STOP COMMUNITY CHRISTMAS

One Stop is a collaborative effort of over 170 area organizations to come together at Christmas time and provide help and hope to families from seven counties (Clark, Coles, Cumberland, Douglas, Edgar, Moultrie and Shelby) during the holiday season. One Stop is about the power of partnership to make a difference in the community. This will mark the ninth year for One Stop and to date they have served over 15,899 children. Last year (2018), we helped over 900 families and were able to provide a wonderful Christmas experience for over 2,000 children. One Stop has truly strengthened our communities. All four stations are involved with One Stop by sharing sign up dates and times for families who need assistance and asking the community to volunteer the day of One Stop. It takes over 3,000 volunteers to make it happen. One Stop is chaired by one of our employees.

STAMP OUT HUNGER

Every spring we team up with the United States Postal Service to help feed the hungry in our community through "Stamp Out Hunger." Members of the USPS record public service announcements along with an on-air interview a day prior to the event to create awareness. Mail carriers collect the goods and donate them to the local food pantry. This combined effort has resulted in more than 15,000 pounds of food being collected and distributed to those in need.

SALVATION ARMY BELL RINGING

101.3 WMCI partnered with the Salvation Army of Coles and Cumberland counties to kick off the 2018 Red Kettle season. During the four-hour live broadcast, listeners who donated to the kettle were treated to free Starbucks coffee and County Market doughnuts. We also encouraged listeners to include their friends or family to volunteer ringing the bell for a two-hour shift. For Coles County, there were 1,920 two-hour shifts that the Salvation Army needed to cover.

MUMS FOR MOMS

101.3 WMCI teams with Sarah Bush Lincoln Health Center's Mobile Mammography Unit to offer beautiful mums, home grown by our very own Jeff Nalley, Cromwell Ag Director. The Mobile Mammography Unit is on sight and provides mammograms to those in need. Proceeds from the sale of these gorgeous flowers benefit the mobile mammography unit to assist the less fortunate in the area.







SPECIAL OLYMPICS FAMILY FESTIVAL









For more than 30 years, thousands of volunteers have gathered at Lake Land College for the Special Olympics Family Festival. It's a day-long celebration for the athletes and their Friends for a Day to play games, sing karaoke, watch a parade and soak up some sun and fun. As the media partner, 101.3 WMCI provides airtime to drive volunteer recruitment. The day can't happen without the nearly 2,000 volunteers who devote their time to this wonderful and very worthy cause. Since the beginning of our partnership nearly 25 years ago, we have never fell short on volunteers. Bub & Renee, hosts of the WMCI the parade, which is part of opening
