

### **Accumulating Snow & Dangerously Cold Wind Chills**

Hazardous Travel Today

### **Key Messages**


- → Snow and blowing snow today ending from north to south after 6pm.
- → Peak snow rates from 7 AM to 2 PM.
- → Visibilities reduced to less than a ½ mile in snow and blowing snow.
- → Dangerous wind chills -15 to -30 into Sunday morning.

## **NEW Important Updates**

- Slightly reduced snowfall amounts across far southern Iowa and Nebraska.
- New Wind Chill Advisory for Tonight into Sunday

### **Winter Storm Warning Details**




In effect through midnight tonight.



Combination of:


- → Snow totals of 3" to 7", locally higher
- → Blowing and drifting snow
- → Peak snow rates 7 AM to 2 PM
- → Dangerous wind chills

# Dangerously Cold Wind Chills


Coldest time periods are Saturday morning and again Sunday morning

# Wind Chill Advisory through tonight for most areas

- → Wind chill values will drop to as low as -20 to -30
- → Coldest temperatures of the season thus far

#### **Preventative Measures if Outdoors**

- → Dress in layers
- → Limit outdoor activity and keep pets inside
- → Take frequent breaks if out doing snow removal and keep all skin covered.
- → If snow removal can be delayed, Sunday looks like a better day with warmer temperatures and less windy conditions Sunday afternoon.
- Include a winter survival kit in vehicle





## **Expected Wind Gust Timeline**

### Wind

- The strongest winds are expected on today with gusts of 35-40 mph.
- Wind direction will be from the north.
- The wind combined with the fluffy snow consistency will result in a prolonged period of blowing snow, and resulting visibility restrictions.
- Winds will diminish on Saturday night into Sunday morning but cold temperatures will still create very cold wind chill values into early Sunday.
