Important Updates

NEW

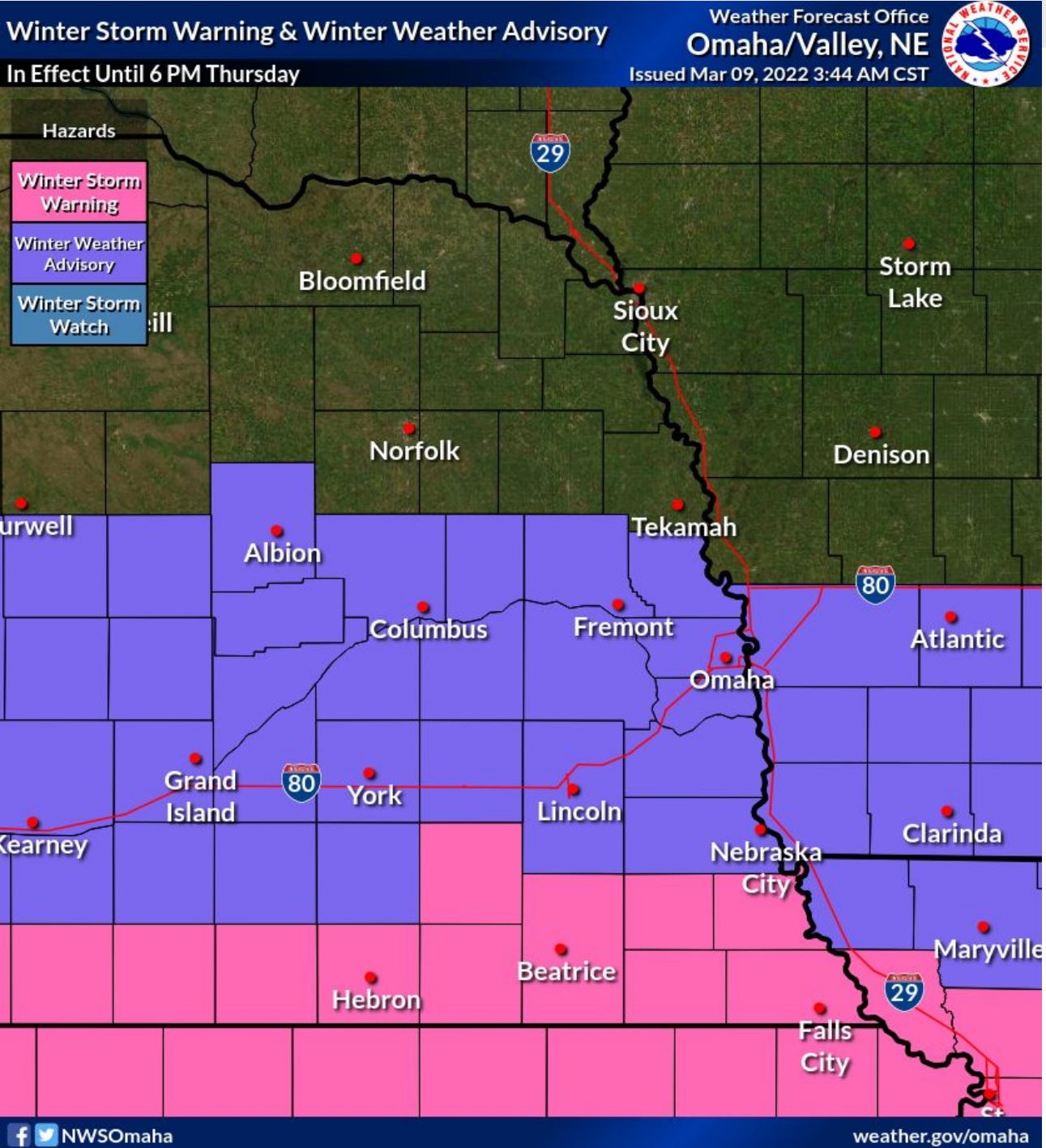
A **Winter Storm Warning** and **Winter Weather Advisory** have been issued.

Key Points

- Accumulating snow likely for parts of Nebraska and Iowa (> 70% Chance)
- Thursday morning commute will be impacted.
- Expect regional travel disruptions, with impacts for Interstate 80 & Interstate 29.

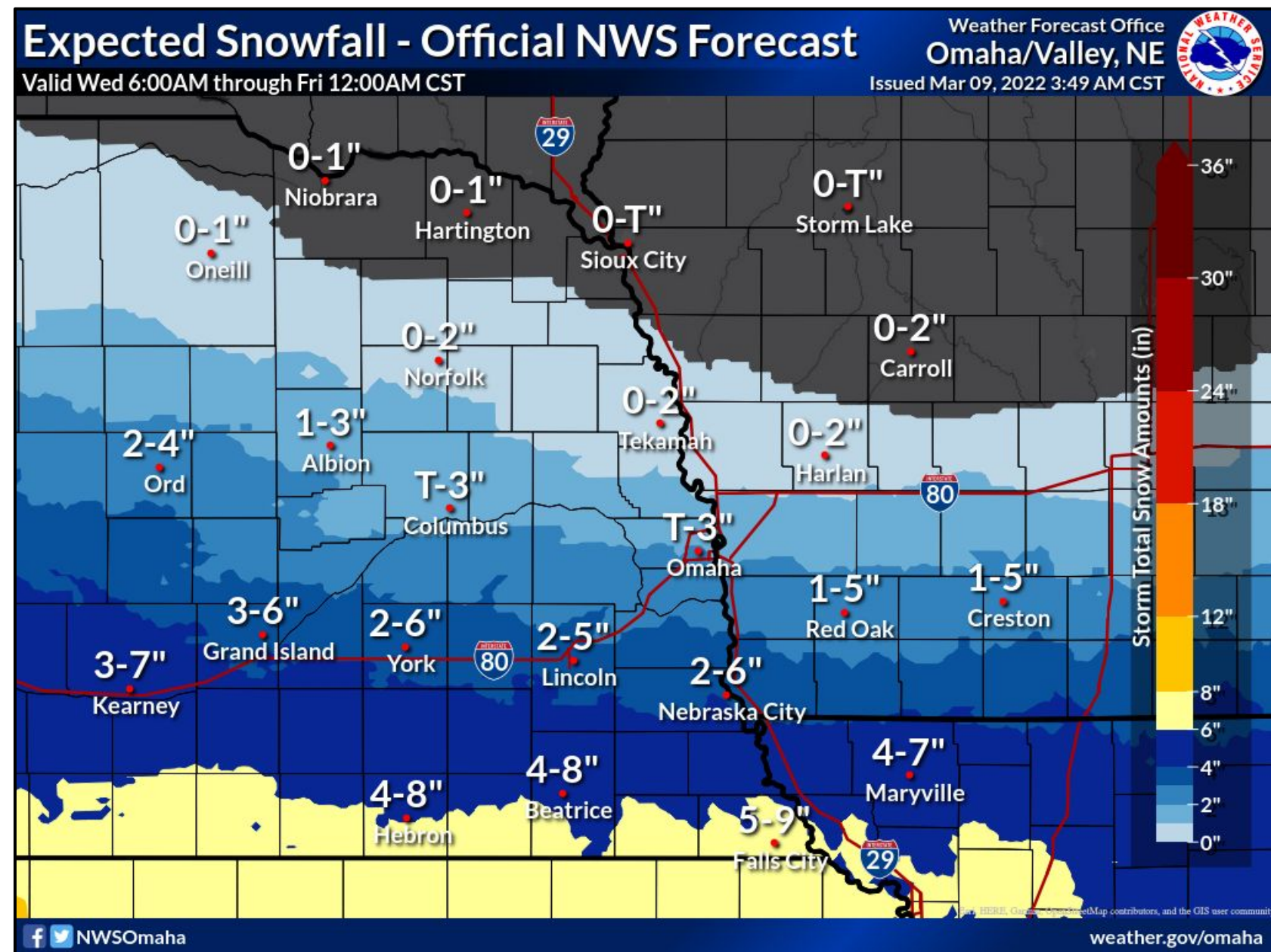
Amounts through Midnight Thursday Night

Forecast Considerations

- Forecaster confidence in snowfall occurring is **HIGH**
- Forecaster confidence in amounts is **MODERATE**

Snowfall Details

- Snow Type: 
Heavy & Wet Light & Fluffy
- Heaviest snow falling around 2 AM - 8 AM Thursday morning
 - Peak snowfall rates up to 1 inch per hour are possible for brief periods.
- Isolated higher amounts are possible near the NE/KS border.
- Gusty northeast winds up to 20 mph may produce patchy blowing and drifting.

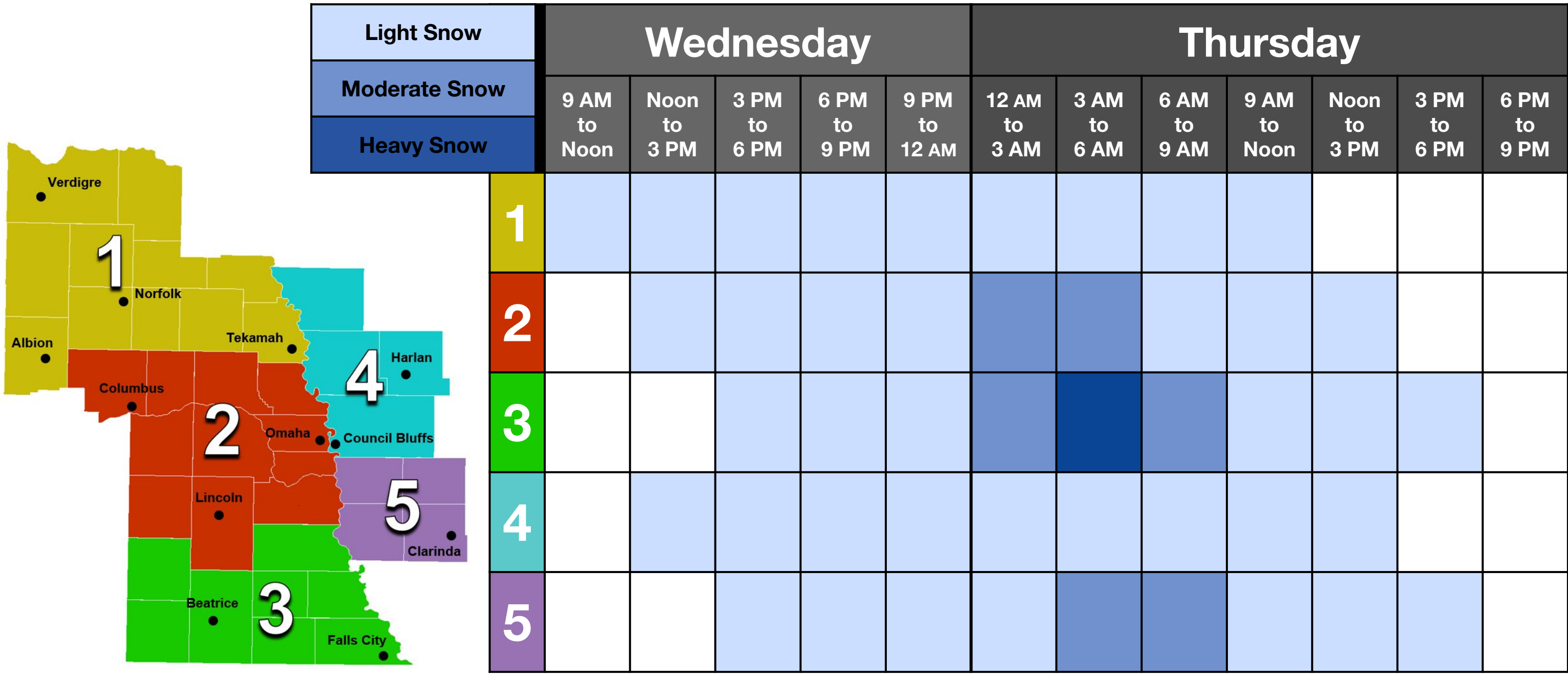

Heaviest Snow Falling 2 AM to 8 AM Thursday Morning

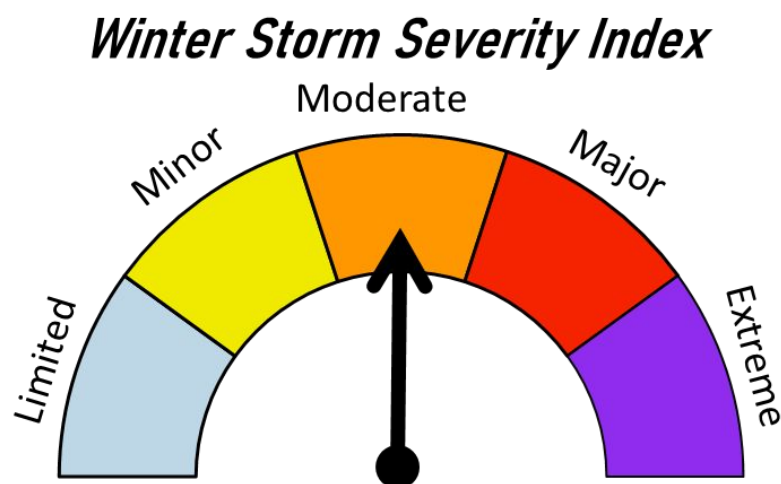




Winter Storm Severity Index

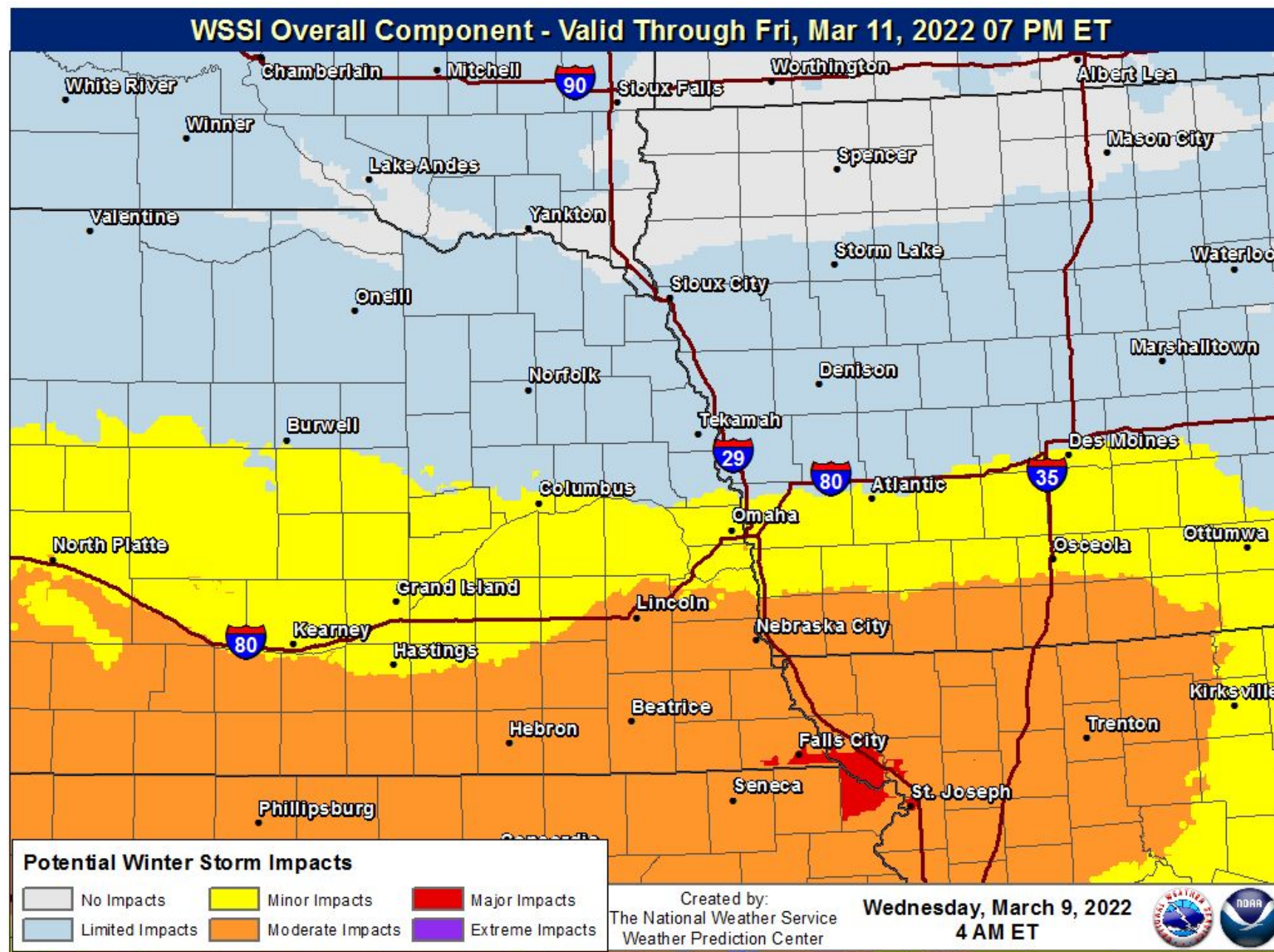

Potential Impacts

- Travel disruptions along Interstates 80 and 29
- Negative impacts for the commutes, especially Thursday morning
- Cold temperatures may be hazardous for any stranded travelers
