

Key Messages

- → Extremely cold conditions will occur (95%), especially from Wed. night through Sat.
 - ♦ Wind chills of -30 to -50 degrees
- → Blizzard conditions are possible (60% chance) late Wednesday into Thursday. Several inches of snow and winds up to 50 mph expected.
 - Travel will be dangerous if not impossible!

Important Forecast Changes


- → Freezing Drizzle/Light Snow Wednesday, before switching to all snow.
- → Lowered snowfall totals slightly.

It will not take much snow to create dangerous, if not impossible travel conditions!

Overall Forecast Confidence










Dangerous Wind Chills - Wed. & Wed. Night


COLDEST WIND CHILLS

Details

- → Daytime wind chills as low as -1 to -20 over northeast NE on Wednesday.
- → Wind chills drop to -30 to -45Wednesday night.



COLDEST WIND CHILLS


6 AM Thursday - 6 AM Friday

Minimum WindChill **Details**

- → The *warmest* wind chills on these days will be in the -20s and -30s!
- → For reference: Omaha last had a wind chill of -40 during the great cold snap of February 16, 2021.
- Prior to that, it was February 2, 1996.
 - Only once in the past 25 years!









Dangerous Wind Chills- Saturday & Christmas




6 AM Saturday - 6 AM Sunday

Details

→ Daytime wind chills from -10 to -20 on Saturday and single digits above and below 0 on Sunday.

Extreme Cold, Especially Thursday and Friday, but Continuing Through The Weekend


Details

- → Extremely cold conditions will occur (95%), especially from Wed. night through Sat.
 - ♦ Wind chills of -30 to -50
- → Even as conditions warm slightly, the weekend will remain dangerously cold.
- → Blizzard conditions are possible (60% chance) late Wednesday into Thursday. Several inches of snow and winds up to 50 mph expected.

Expected Impacts

- → Dangerous travel conditions expected with potential whiteout conditions.
- → Combined with the extreme cold, you do not want to be stranded in this dangerous weather.



Blizzard Conditions Possible Wed - Thu

Forecast Details

- → Winds gusting up to 40-50 mph
- → Several inches of snow
- → Dangerously cold wind chills: -40 to -50


Timing

- → Light snow and freezing drizzle begins Wednesday morning in northeast NE and spreads southeast through the day.
- → Greatest impacts expected late Wednesday night through Thursday evening as winds ramp up.

Impacts

- → Dangerous, if not impossible travel conditions expected with potential whiteout conditions.
- → Combined with the extreme cold, YOU DO NOT WANT TO BE STRANDED IN THIS!






Snow Amount Potential



Timing of Worst Travel Conditions



The worst conditions, including the combination of wind, snow, extreme cold, and reduced visibility look to focus late Wednesday night through early Thursday afternoon. The wind continues to be very strong through Friday, and will continue to cause issues with blowing and drifting snow all the way through the day on Friday.





Strong Winds Thursday


Areas of blowing snow possible

Wind Details

- → Strong northwest winds with gusts of 40 to 50 mph likely on Thursday.
- → Visibility reductions are likely due to the interaction between the strong winds and newly fallen snow.

Impacts

- → Significant travel impacts possible due to blowing and drifting snow.
- → Blizzard conditions/whiteouts could persist even after the snow stops falling.
- → Snow cleanup could take extra time.
- → Some power outages may occur. Never run generators indoors (or in garage)

WINTER STORMS

What Can I Do?

Prepare Your Home

Make your home winter ready. Buy needed supplies before the storm arrives. Have a plan in case you lose power or are unable to leave your home.

Prepare Your Vehicle

Make your vehicle weather ready. Be sure to include a safety kit, cold weather gear, and all the necessities you may need to deal with the storm ahead.

Monitor Your Forecast

Stay up to date with the latest forecast information as the storm approaches, monitor your favorite source for weather information.

Have A Plan

Before weather threatens, be sure to have a communications plan, change travel plans, and prepare for the impacts to your routine.

Know The Terms

Winter Storm Watch: There is potential of a significant winter weather event. Conditions are possible but not imminent.

Winter Weather Advisory: Winter weather is imminent and may cause inconveniences.

Winter Storm Warning: A significant winter storm is imminent and is a danger to life and property.

Blizzard Warning: A significant winter storm with strong winds, snow, and low visibility is imminent and is a danger to life and property.

Ice Storm Warning: Dangerous ice accumulations are imminent

Key Messages



Impacts

Chance Of At Least 2"





→ Start: Wednesday morning north, later Wednesday elsewhere

Timing

- → Peak: Late Wednesday evening through Thursday noon
- → End: Snow ends early Thursday afternoon. Blowing snow through Friday
