

Winter Storm Watch Issued

In effect from 3 AM January 2 through 12 PM January 3

Key Messages


- → Snowfall 1" to 6". Heaviest amounts near the South Dakota border.
- → Ice accumulation up to 0.10"
- → There is considerable uncertainty yet in the storm track which will impact precipitation type and amounts.

Timing

- → Snow and freezing rain could begin as early as midnight Monday morning.
- → Peak precipitation rates Monday night.

Overall Forecast Confidence









Probability of Snowfall Amounts

Percent Chance of 6" of Snow






Ice Accumulation Forecast

Ice Potential

- → Confidence is low for ice accumulation forecast amounts and location.
- → When confidence increases, the winter storm watch could be expanded to the south and east.

Impacts

→ Icing combined with strong winds forecast on Tuesday (gusts up to 35 mph) could potentially lead to power outages.

- → A Winter Storm Watch means there is potential of a significant winter weather event. Conditions are possible, but not imminent.
