Winter Headlines in effect from 12 PM Monday, January 2 through 6 PM Tuesday, January 3

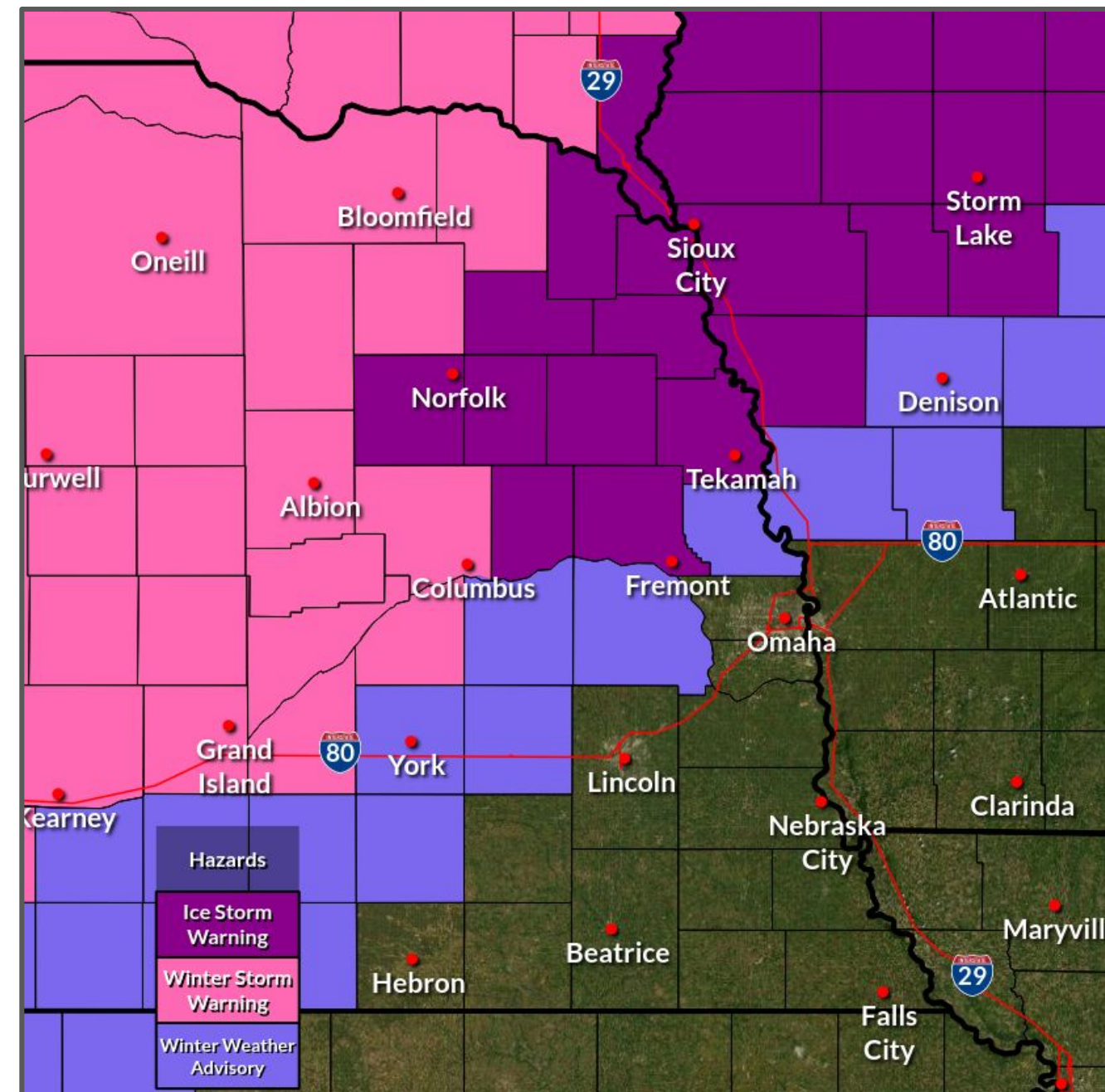
Key Messages

- Travel could become difficult if not impossible in some areas. Power outages could occur.
- Ice accumulation forecast of 0.10" to 0.40".
- Heaviest snowfall forecast of 4" to 10", with greatest amounts near the South Dakota border.

Important Forecast Changes

- Winter storm warning, ice storm warning, and winter weather advisory has been issued. Winter storm watch is no longer in effect.
- Slightly later onset of precipitation in our area.

Overall Forecast Confidence



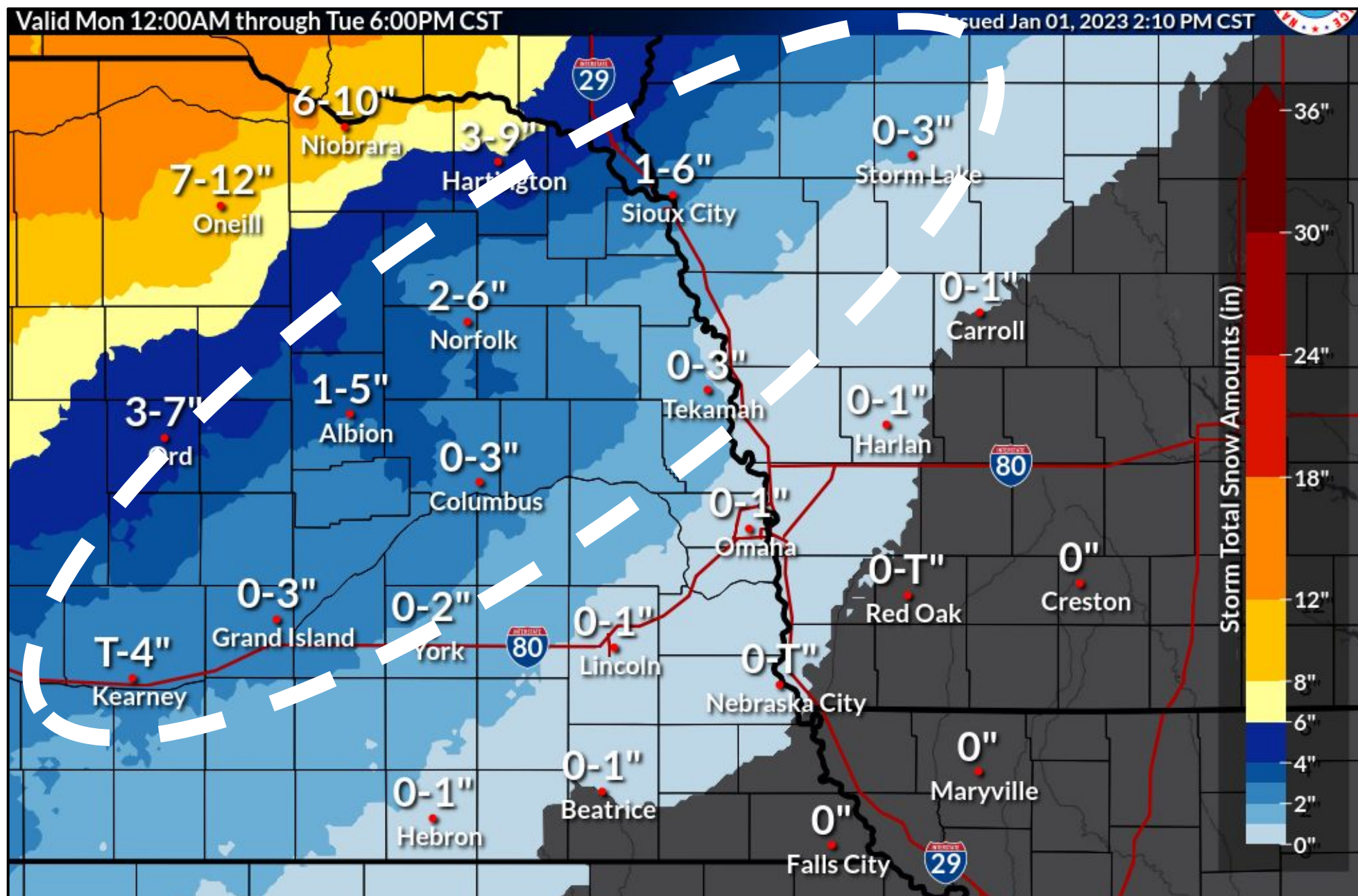


Snowfall Forecast Range

There could be a tight gradient in snow amounts due to precipitation type.



Significant icing of 0.10 to 0.40 also expected in the white-dashed region.

The combination of ice and snow could make travel especially difficult.

All of the snow ends in our area by early Tuesday evening.

January 1, 2023

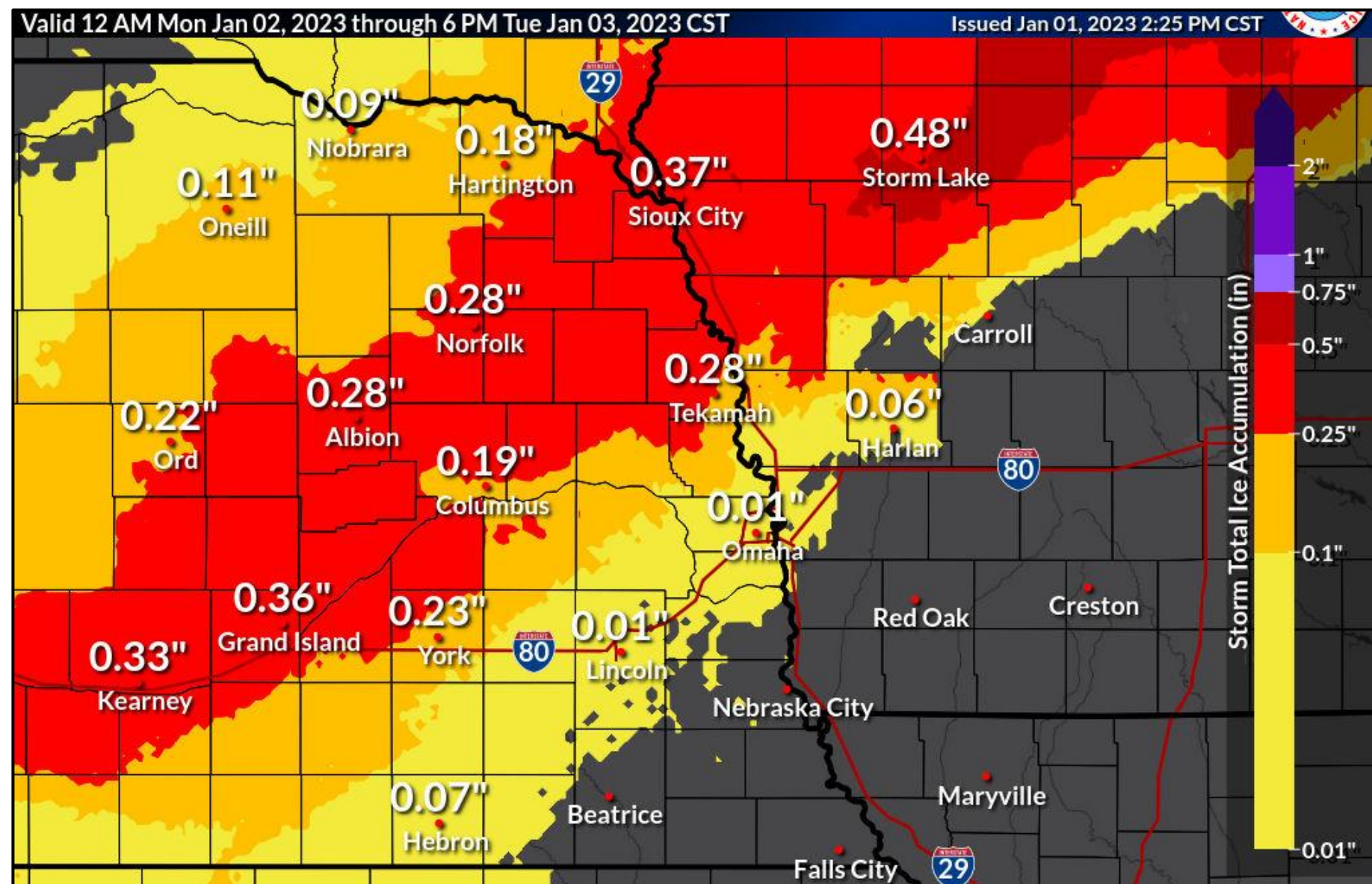

Ice Potential

- Ice amounts could range up to 0.10 to 0.40" in portions of central and northeast Nebraska into northern Iowa.
- Best icing accumulations will occur Monday afternoon into Monday night before precipitation changes to snow.

Impacts

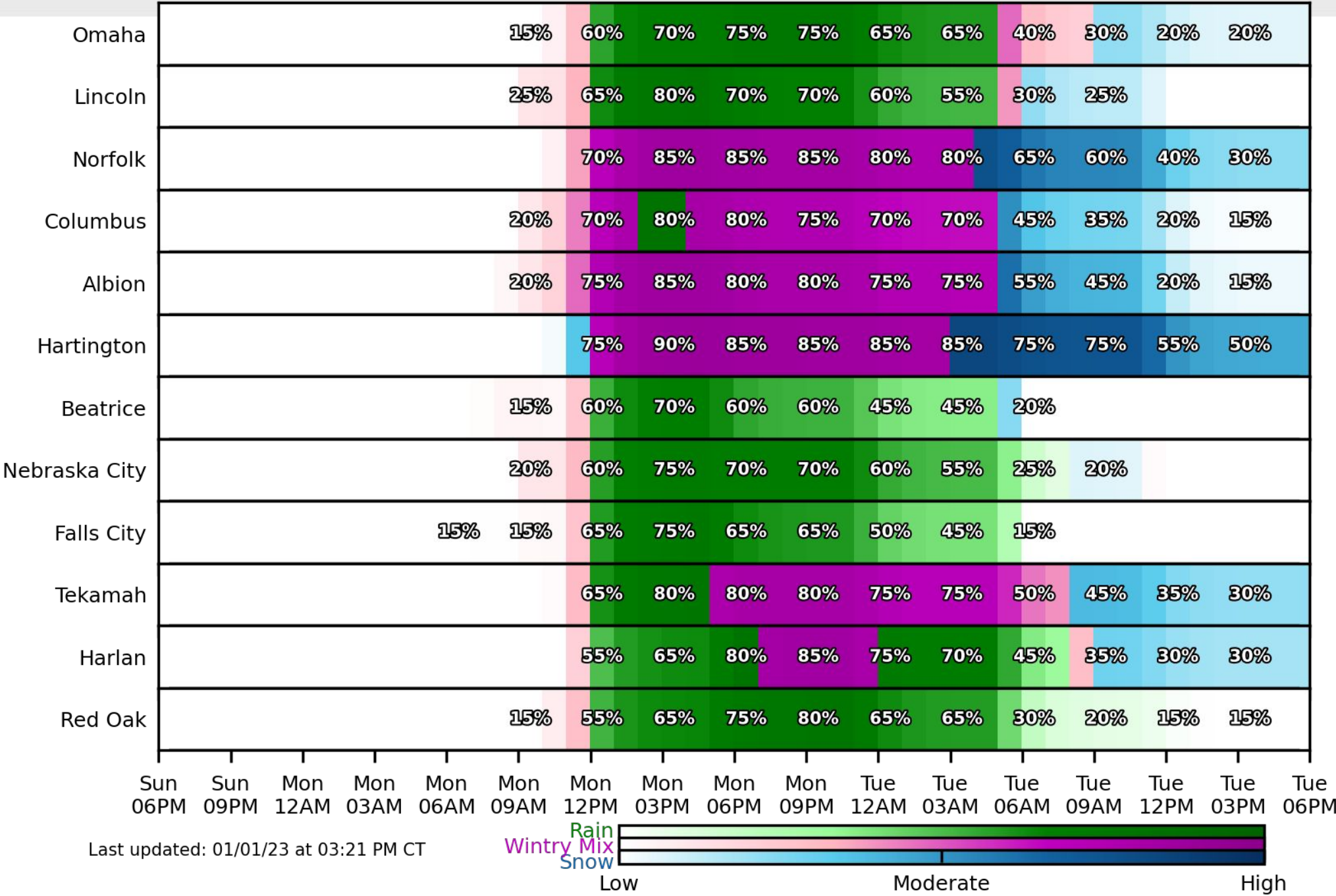
- Icing combined with strong northwest winds forecast on Tuesday (gusts up to 35 mph) could potentially lead to power outages or downed branches.
- Ice may make travel difficult if not impossible in some areas.
- The Monday evening and Tuesday morning commutes will be affected.

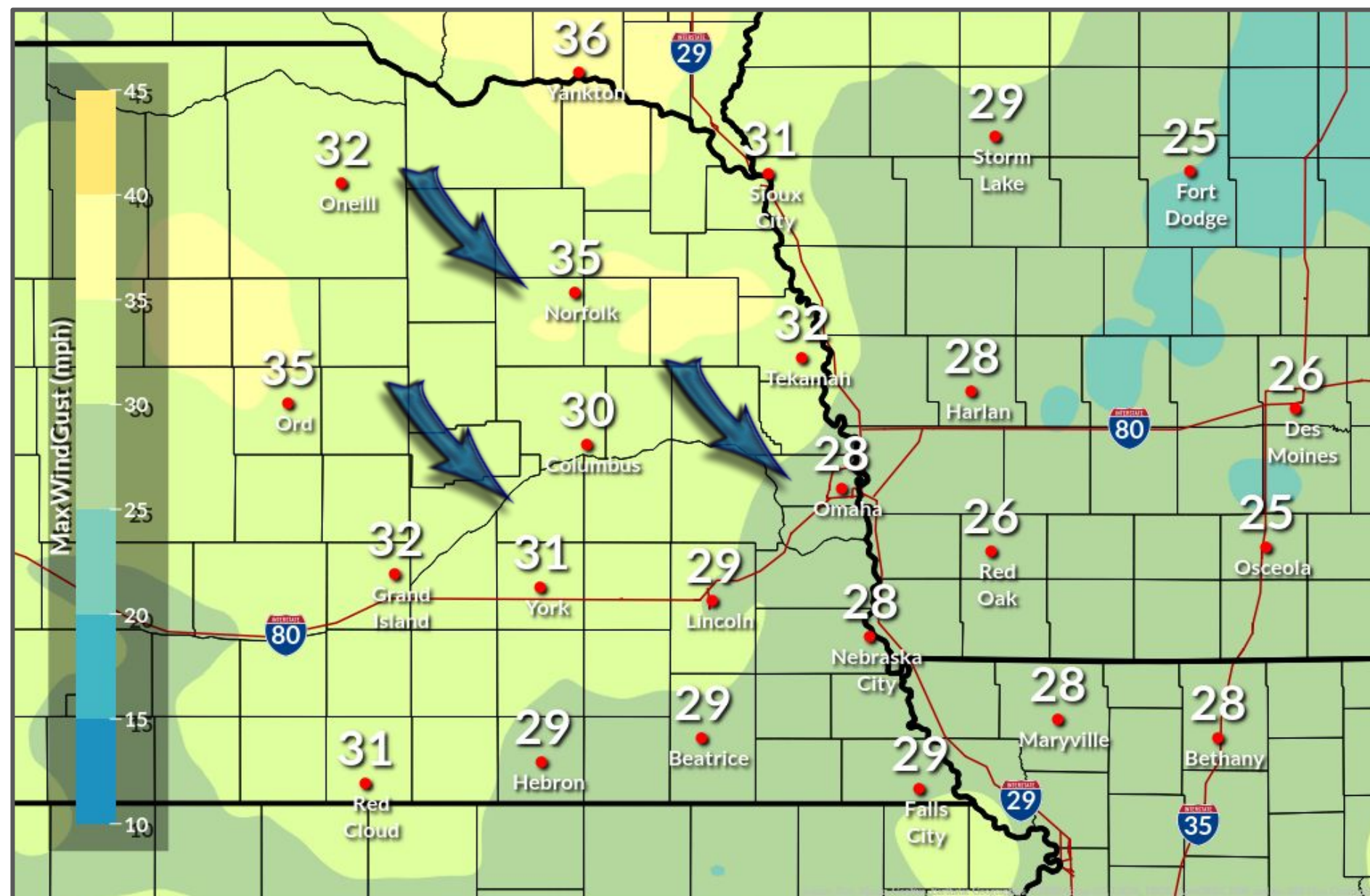

Wind Potential

- Monday: Northeast 10 to 20 mph
- Tuesday: Northwest 25 to 35 mph
