Y Story



Glenn Carpenter Centre History

- 1770 Land granted to James Simonds as part of 2,000 acre grant to be cleared and farmed
- 1935 Original owners build existing lodge as a private recreational facility
- 1955 Property is transferred to Charles Newcombe Wilson and Saint John Terminals Ltd.
- 2000 Glenn Carpenter purchases and donates 220-acre property to YMCA
- 2002 New picnic shelter built for Summer Day Camp programming



Glenn Carpenter Centre History

2005-2009 – Summer day camps expands by one week each summer and begins specialty camps


2012 – Youth Leadership programs begin

- 2016 Full assessment is completed of upgrades needed
- 2018 New hanger with washrooms and lodge upgrades completed
- 2019 Counsellor in Training (CIT) program begins
- 2021 New walking trail completed surrounding the lake
- 2022 Board of Directors approves business plan to upgrade the Glenn Carpenter Centre to a year round facility

- Providing new space for the community to connect and be well



Project Overview

- Development will occur over 3 phases
- In 2024, the centre will be operating year-round
- Estimated project cost is \$3.5 million

Project Timeline

- New road and parking lot, existing lodge upgrades
- Day camp reaches target of 1,100 campers per season
 - Natural growth in day camp to 1,200 campers per season
- New multipurpose building construction begins
- New building complete
- After School program opens and day camp expansion
- New field, ropes course, climbing wall, camp sites and program upgrades complete
- Day camp expansion reaches 1,500









